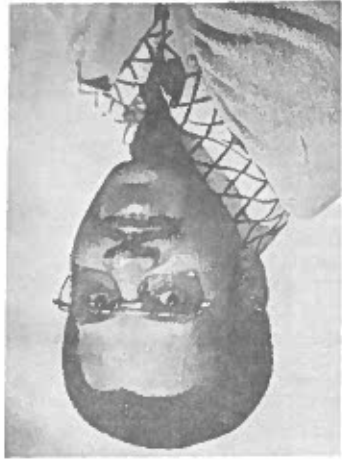
We are happy to report that our meet which is contested at Nelson Field on the last Saturday of April, is now known as "one of the two largest track & field meets in the State of Ohio."

We congratulate Detroit Northern who took home the championship trophy last year after a fine performance. Congratulations and Good Luck once again. First out of state to win title.

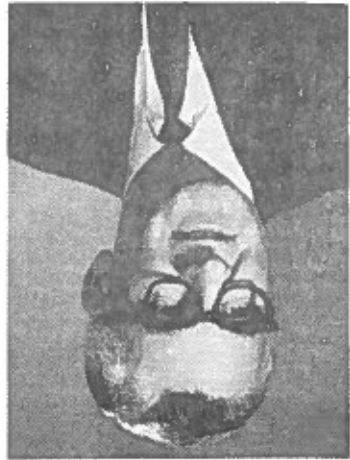

HARRY BELL - HONORARY REFEREE



The Bellaire Relays proudly salutes Harry O. Bell as the 1972 Honorary Referee. A native of Bellaire, Mr. Bell is a 1927 graduate of Bellaire High School. For the past nineteen years, he has been the State Examiner, School Division, Auditor of the state of Ohio.

When the Bellaire Relays first invited teams from beyond the local valley area, Mr. Bell was instrumental in the added organization. He served as housing chairman for several years, organizing the overnight housing and secured meals for all visiting athletes and their coaches. He was named General Relays Chairman in 1962. At this time, he designed the Bellaire Relays emblem, set up the program booklet, and made the first appointments to the fourteen separate committees, covering all facets of the Relays. In addition, he has officiated track in the valley for many years.

The Bellaire Relays owes a great deal of credit to Harry Bell. In naming him, we extend the highest honor possible. He has been a tremendous factor in Bellaire Relays for which we are all grateful.

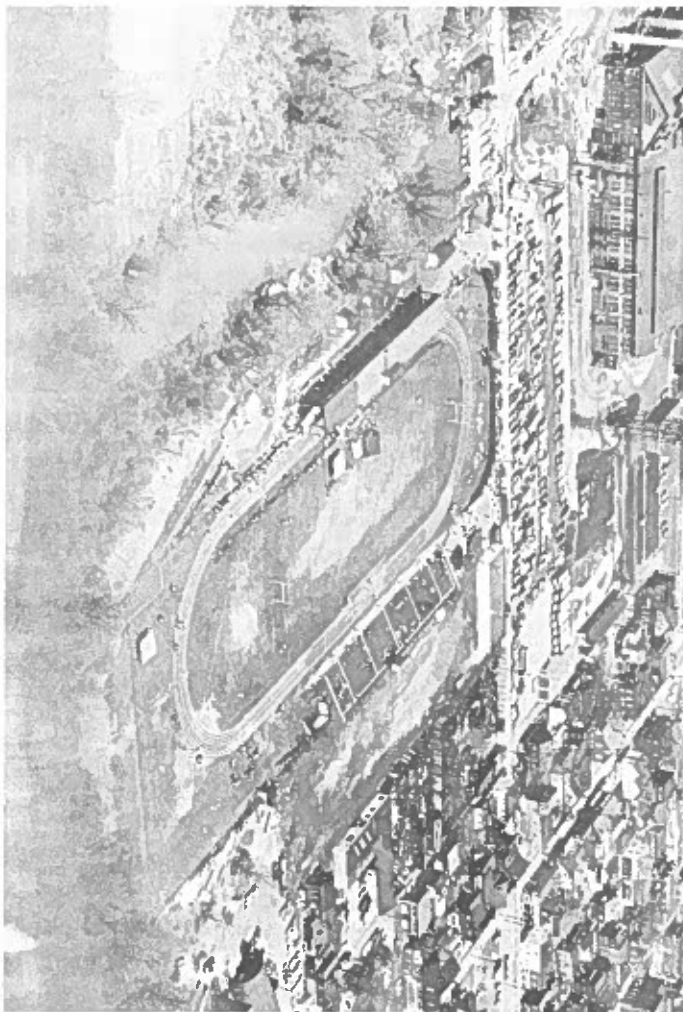

Aerial View of All Weather Track at Nelson Field



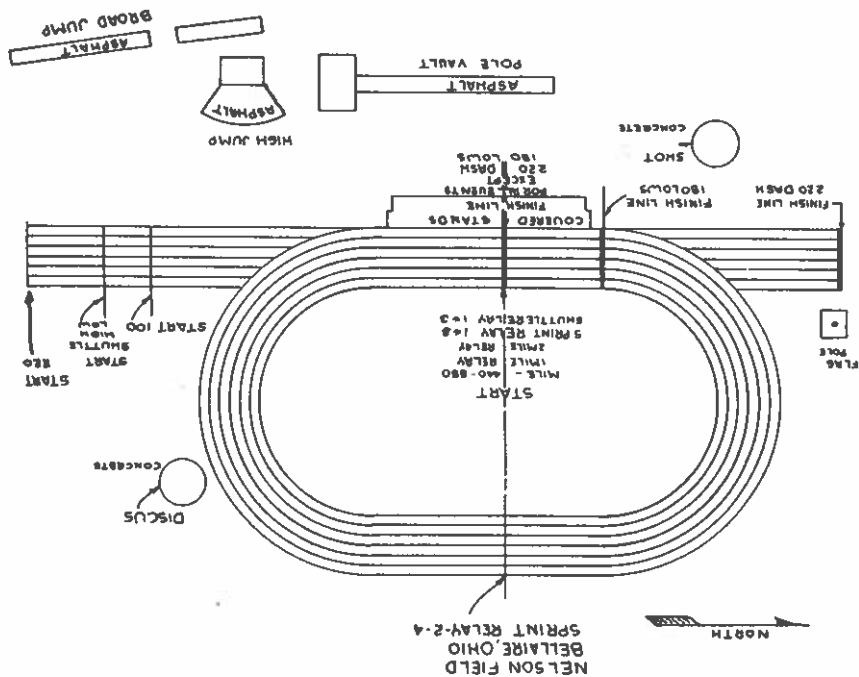

LOCATION: Nelson Field - 26th Street, Bellaire, Ohio

TRACK: All Weather 440 yards with 220 yard straight away.

SCORING: Six places will count 10 - 8 - 6 - 4 - 2 - 1.

SPIKES: One fourth of one inch maximum.

The area adjacent to the finish line will be fenced off and contestants found in this area will cause his teammates to be disqualified. The finish line officials must have a good view at all times.

A medical tent will be located at the North End of the field and available to all teams. This area will be supervised and directed by Dr. Thomas Ring along with a competent staff.

All relays will be run against time.

Relay Exchanges: The 880 yard sprint relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In all other relays, the California exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position of the incoming runner.

Restrictions: Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile cannot take part in more than one other track event. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events.

Shot put and discus will be thrown from cement. All other field event areas are of asphalt. Soft rubber shoes or ¼ inch spikes acceptable.

The shot put and discus will be run in flights according to the best distances. All schools entering teams in our relays must abide by the rules and regulations adopted by their State Associations.

HOUSING

Visiting teams coming over 125 air miles will be provided lodging in private homes. We are sorry but we must limit lodging to the first 25 teams, therefore, it is to your advantage to send in your entry blank early. Housing requests must be postmarked no later than April 17, 1971. All later applications will not be accepted. A maximum of 25 per team will be accommodated. Your team will be fed upon arrival on Friday, your boys will be entertained as our special guests that night in a variety of different ways. They will be given their breakfast on Saturday morning and then transported to the stadium.

HEADQUARTERS

Bellaire High School Gym-Auditorium located at 35th & Belmont Sts., Bellaire, Ohio. Ample room for car and bus parking.

ENTRY FEE

There will be an entry fee of 50 cents for each boy that is entered in the meet. Checks for the total amount should be made to the Bellaire Relays Committee & enclosed with your official entry blank.

Coaches & Administrators will be guests of the Big Reds Touch-Club at a smoker in the Elks Club.

CAL GIFFIN



Calvin J. "Cal" Giffin, principal at St. Clairsville High School and former coach at Bellaire High, has been named to the Ohio Hall of Fame of the Ohio Association of Track Coaches.

The 42-year-old Giffin was inducted into the "hall" and presented with a plaque emblematic of the honor at a meeting of nearly 500 track coaches at Scott's Inn in Columbus on Friday, January 28, 1972. Generally credited with being the main cog in the development of the Bellaire Relays into one of the finest high school track meets east of the Mississippi River, Giffin was selected for the award because of his outstanding record in coaching and his contributions to the track coaches' organization, with which he served six terms as a vice-president, directed state wide publicity for six years, and three times was a clinic speaker.

A former Bellaire High three sport star, Giffin returned to his alma mater after graduation from West Liberty State College. In 1958 he took over as head track coach and served in that capacity for ten years, during which the Big Reds set new school records in all events, but one. He developed the Bellaire thincads into one of the valley powerhouses and coached many outstanding athletes during his tenure.

Giffin has won wide reputation as a track and field official and has been referee of many major meets, including regionals, and also works the Ohio State meet. He is also commissioner of football officials for the OVAC and was recently elected to the Eastern Ohio district board of the Ohio High School Athletic Association. It was once said of Giffin that he "eats and sleeps" Bellaire Relays and this is certainly true. Over the years he has devoted endless hours of work in making the Relays a successful event. With his sound judgment and unselfish efforts the Relays have grown to be the second largest track and field meet in Ohio.

At this time the Bellaire Relays would like to say "congratulations Cal, and thank you for your outstanding contributions."

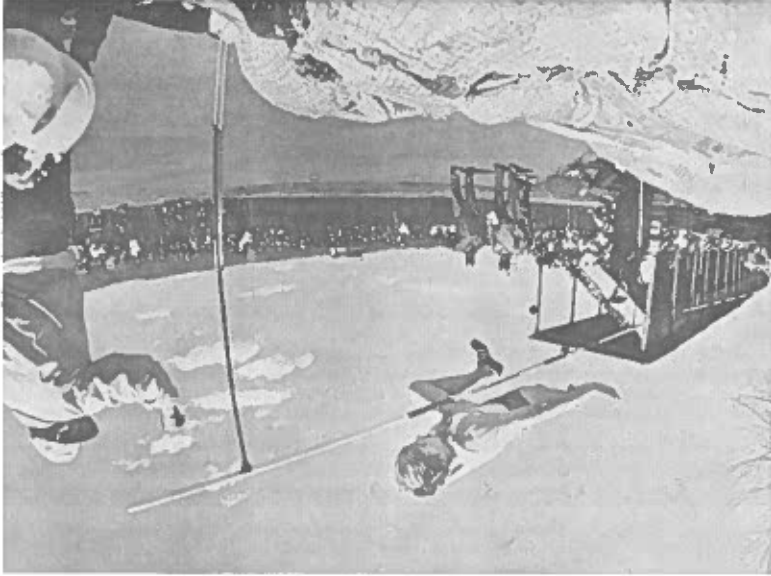

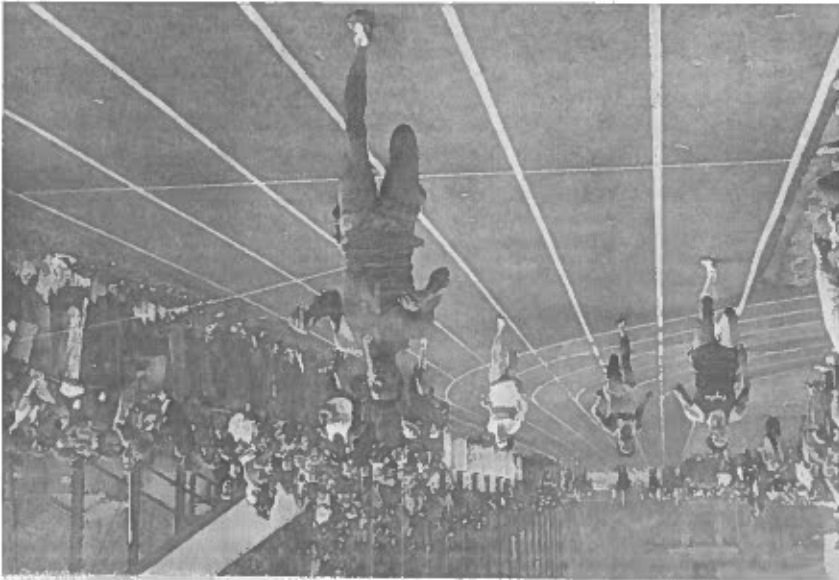

The Bellaire Relays congratulates Marshall on his fine efforts of last season and wishes him best of luck in his future endeavors.

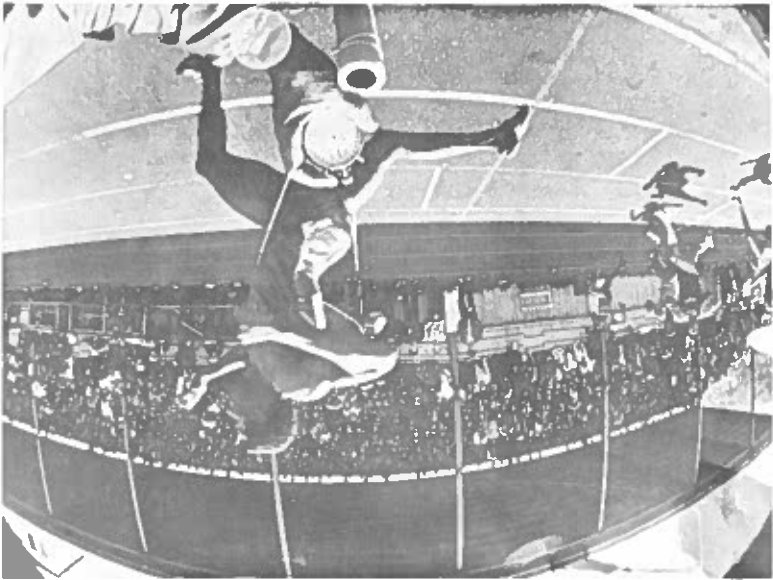


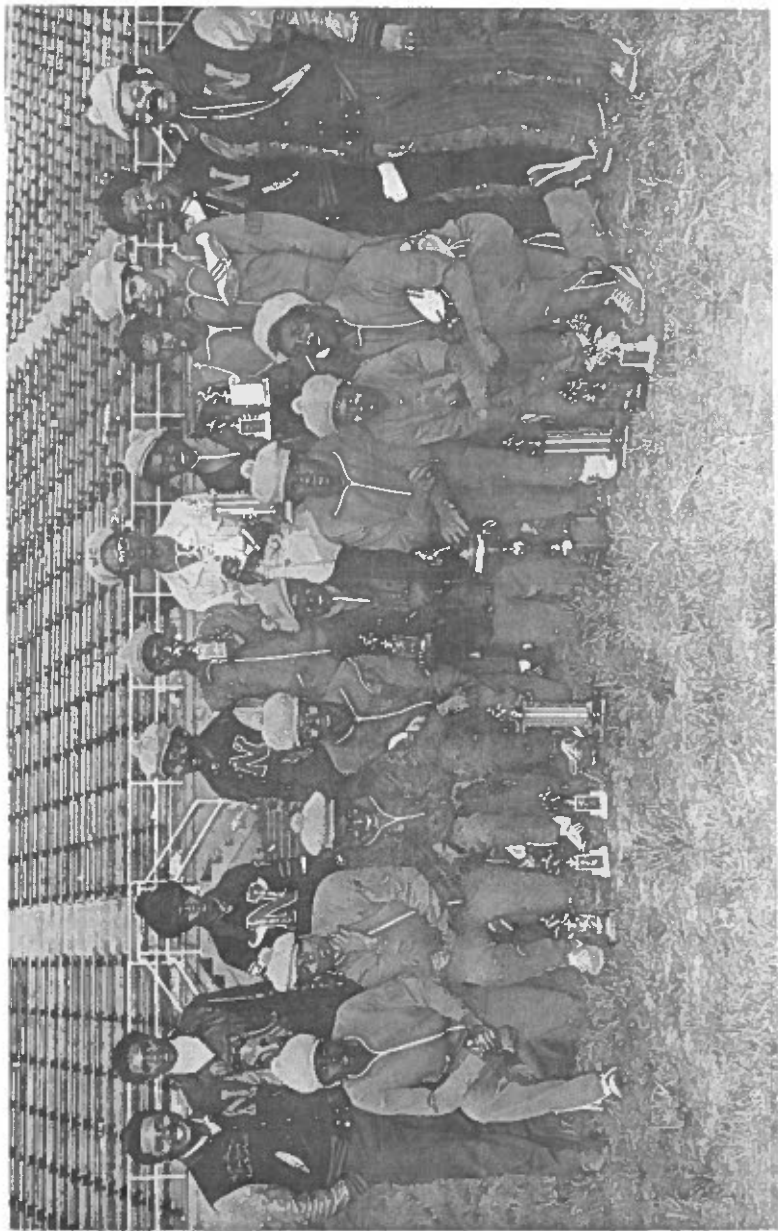

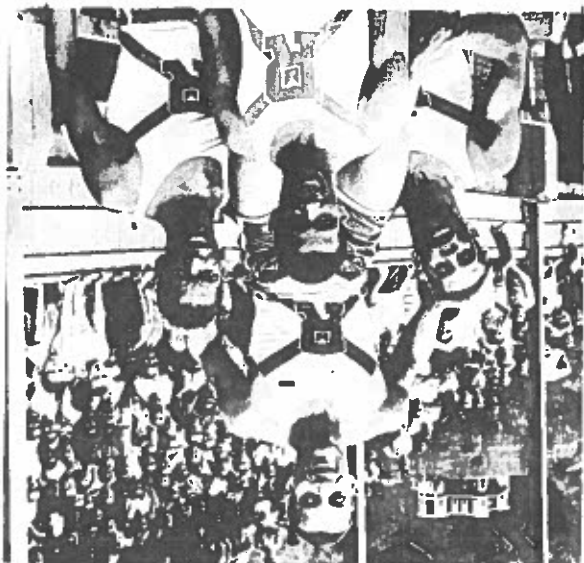
