Bellaire's Jones Top Wrestler in Tourney

John Marshall High won its first Ohio Valley Athletic Conference wrestling championship Saturday night before a roaring, tourney-record crowd at the Moundsville Fieldhouse.

With action completed in 10 of the 13 weight classes, the Monarchs were deadlocked with up-river rivals Weirton and Brooke each with 80 points. But the, Red Riders and Bruins were blanked the rest of the way while Bill Hinegardner's squad picked up 10 big points to tuck away the title.

John Marshall had been the pre-tourney favorite, with 11 seeded grapplers, but apprehension set in among Monarch fans Saturday afternoon when only one of their matmen survived the semi-finals. However, the hosts bounced back strong in the consolation bracket to close in on Brooke and Weirton and then cleaned up in the higher weights at the night session to gain its coveted triumph.

John Marshall had only one individual titlist, Jim Meeker, the all-state football player who took honors at 185 pounds. It was Meeker's pin of Weirton's Jim Sellitti that clinched the team championship for the Monarchs, although it had been Scott Lehasky, promoted to the starting lineup for this tourney, who put them ahead when he copped fifth-place honors at 175. Heavyweight Dave Crow's pin in the thirdplace consolation simply iced the cake.

While Brooke and Weirton, with their 80 points apiece, shared the runnerup trophy -10 points in arrear of J. Marshall - St. John's Central's defending titlists finished fourth with 681/2 points. Then came a surprisingly-strong Warwood surprisingly-strong team, with 68, followed by Steu-benville 651/2; Martins Ferry, 65; Wintersville, 561/2; Barnesville, 55; Bellaire, 43; Oak Glen, 39; Brilliant, 36½; Wheeling Central, 25; River, 24; Linsly Institute, 16; Wheeling, 15; Bridgeport, 13; Mingo 10; Union Local, 6; Cameron 4, and Triadelphia 2.

Selected for the Dave Bierkortte Memorial Award as the outstanding wrestler in the tourney was Bellaire's crowd-pleasing mite, Art Jones, who scored three pins in four matches. Champion at 98 pounds last year, Jones moved up to 105 this year to grab another title. He is unbeaten in 12 starts this season.
