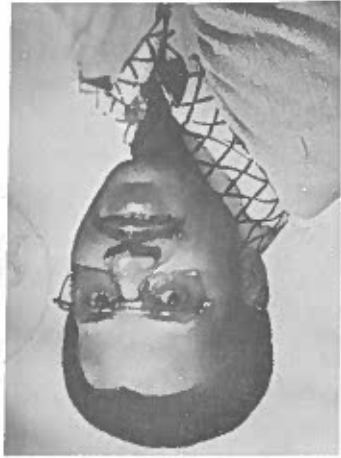

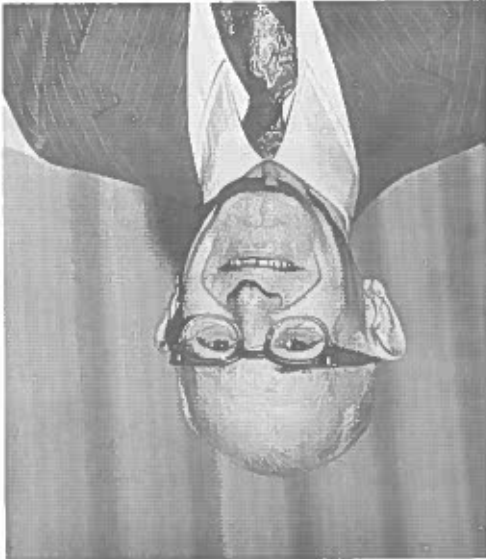

JOHN NIEMIEC - HONORARY REFEREE



The Bellaire Relays is proud to honor John "Butch" Niemiec as its 1973 Honorary Referee.

Butch is a home town product and is one of the great athletes in the school's history. He competed in football, basketball, and track. In 1921 he received the Silver Cup as the most valuable player on the football team. He was also captain of the basketball team and valley shot put champ.

Perhaps some of his greatest fame came at Notre Dame where he played football under the legendary Knute Rockne. Playing half-back for the Fighting Irish, it was Butch who threw the touchdown pass to Johnny "One Play" O'Brien to beat Army 12-6 in 1928. This was the game where Rockne gave his famous pep talk and asked his team to "win one for the Gipper".

He was also a standout baseball player and played for the old Wheeling Stogies in the Middle Atlantic League in 1930. His coaching career includes college teams as well as high school teams. He started at Rice Institute in Texas as an assistant in football and in 1938 returned to Bellaire as head football and track coach for five years.

Butch is retired now but it is through people like him whose unselfishness and dedication to duty make events like this possible. The Relays are indeed proud to honor John Niemiec as its Honorary Referee.

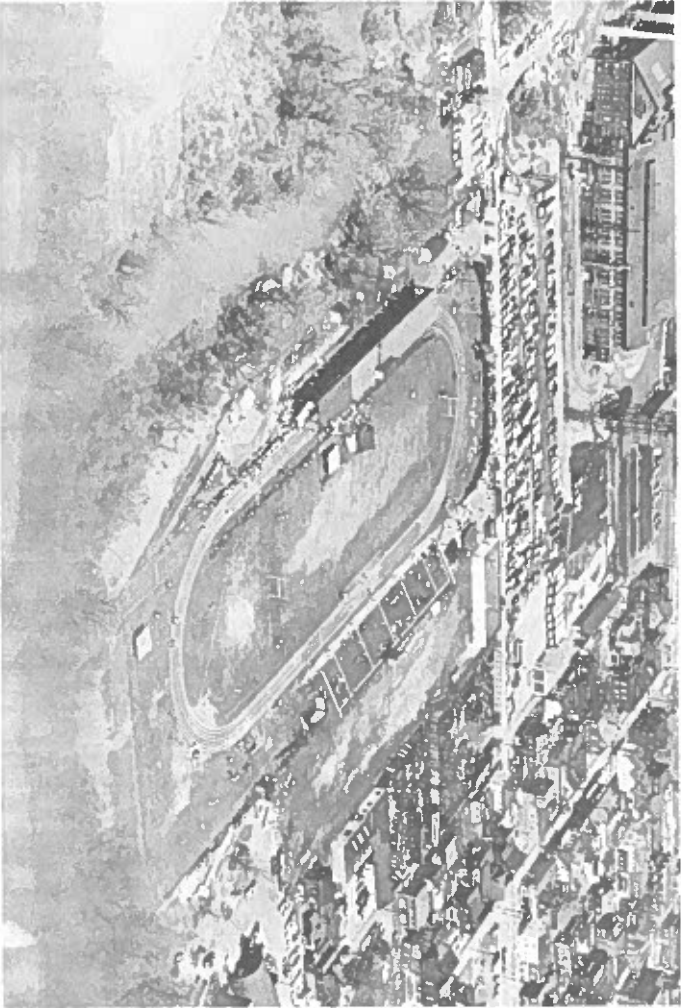

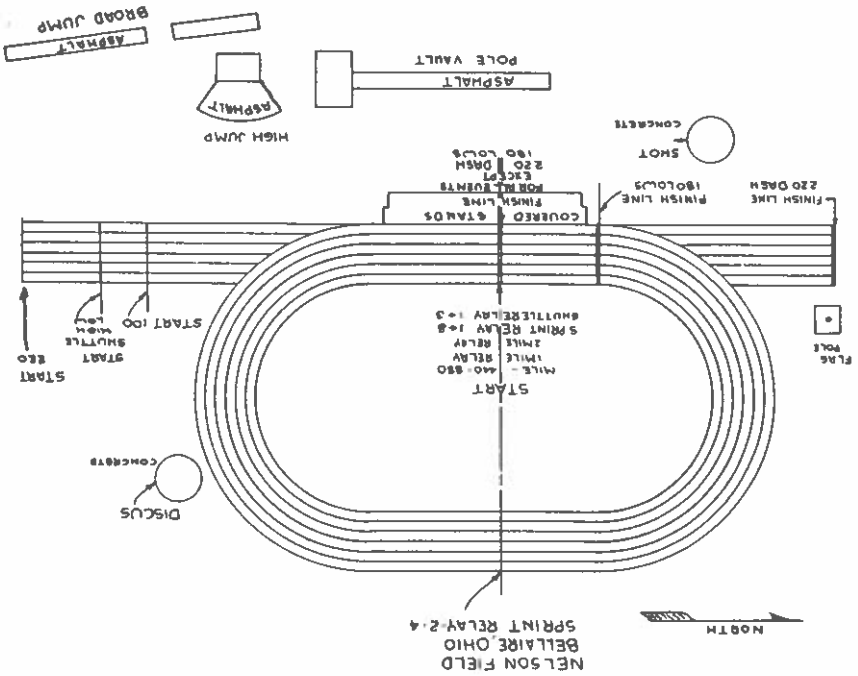

LOCATION: Nelson Field - 26th Street, Bellaire, Ohio

TRACK: All Weather 440 yards with 220 yard straight away.

SCORING: Six places will count 10 - 8 - 6 - 4 - 2 - 1.

SPIKES: One fourth of one inch maximum.

The area adjacent to the finish line will be fenced off and contestants found in this area will cause his teammates to be disqualified. The finish line officials must have a good view at all times.

A medical tent will be located at the North End of the field and available to all teams. This area will be supervised and directed by Dr. Thomas Ring along with a competent staff.

All relays will be run against time.

Relay Exchanges: The 880 yard sprint relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In all other relays, the California exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position of the incoming runner.

Restrictions: Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile cannot take part in more than one other track event. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events.

Shot put and discus will be thrown from cement. All other field event areas are of asphalt. Soft rubber shoes or ¼ inch spikes acceptable.

The shot put and discus will be run in flights according to the best distances. All schools entering teams in our relays must abide by the rules and regulations adopted by their State Associations.

HOUSING

Visiting teams coming over 125 air miles will be provided lodging in private homes. We are sorry but we must limit lodging to the first 25 teams, therefore, it is to your advantage to send in your entry blank early. Housing requests must be postmarked no later than April 17, 1973. All later applications will not be accepted. A maximum of 25 per team will be accommodated. Your team will be fed upon arrival on Friday, your boys will be entertained as our special guests that night in a variety of different ways. They will be given their breakfast on Saturday morning and then transported to the stadium.

HEADQUARTERS

Bellaire High School Gym-Auditorium located at 35th & Belmont Sts., Bellaire, Ohio. Ample room for car and bus parking.

ENTRY FEE

There will be an entry fee of 50 cents for each boy that is entered in the meet. Checks for the total amount should be made to the Bellaire Relays Committee & enclosed with your official entry blank.

Coaches & Administrators will be guests of the Big Reds Touch-Club at a smoker in the Elks Club.

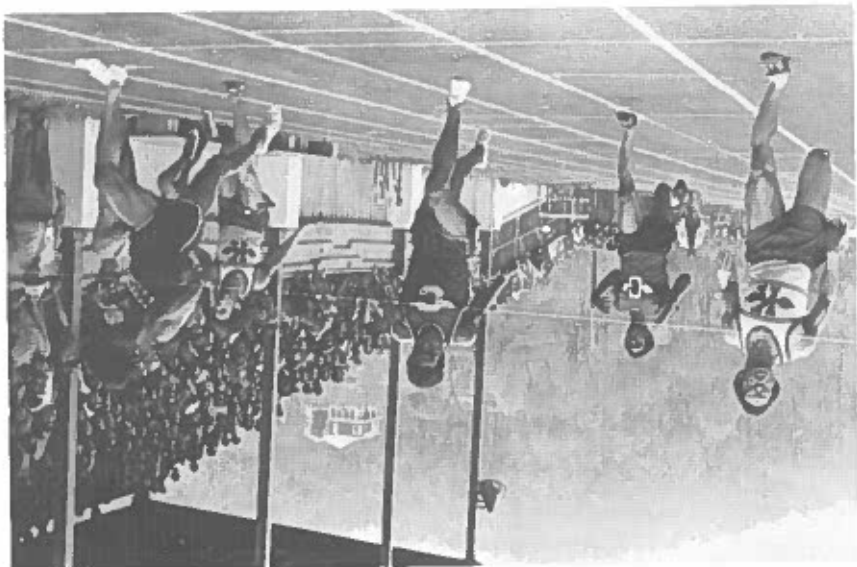

The 1972 Bellaire Relays produced its first triple winner in eight years as Tom Reid of Beckley captured first place in the 100, 220, and 440 yard dashes.

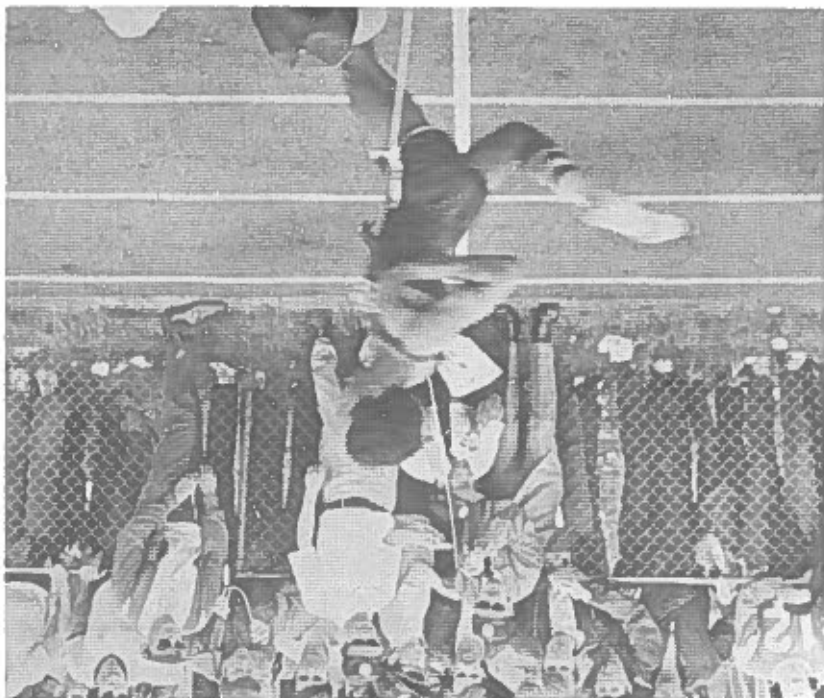
Not since the 1964 Relays when Jim Ward of Columbiana won the same three events, has this feat been accomplished. The mercury footed Reid did not set any new records but his times were close to the existing marks.

This outstanding performer scored thirty of his teams thirty-two points, which was good for third place, and won individual awards as top scorer in the meet, and most points in track events.

In last year's West Virginia State meet, Reid again pulled off his "triple play" as he won his three events breaking records in the 100 with a time of 9.7 and the 220 in 21.1.

He is now enrolled at South Carolina Baptist, an NAIA college, where he will compete in track. The Bellaire Relays congratulates him on his performance of last year and wishes him best of luck in the future.

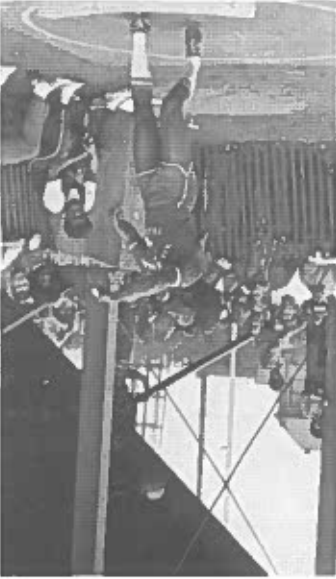

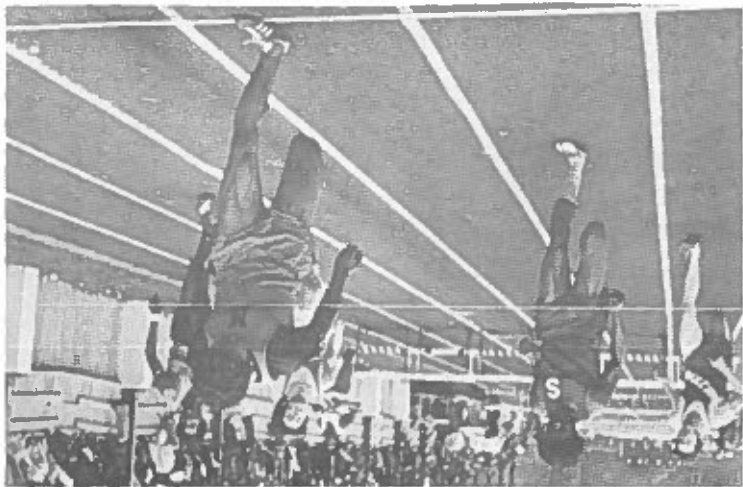
