CHARLES "LEFTY" DRIESELL

Head Basketball Coach

CHARLES "LEFTY" DRIESELL

With the University of Maryland in need of a confident basketball coach that would be able to give the Terps more solid support in the tough Atlantic Coast Conference, they selected Charles "Lefty" Driesell to organize and direct Maryland's basketball program. Wasting very little time Coach Driesell has guided the Terps into two NCAA Regionals and has won the N.I.T.

Driesell's teams are earmarked by their pro-oriented style of play featuring an aggressive man to man defense, an awesome board control front line and an exciting fast break offense called by one pro scout as "the most pro-designed program in the country." In the meantime, Coach Driesell has won over 50 games in his last two seasons and at the moment is one of the top five winning coaches in the country. The popular Duke Graduate has now amassed 253 wins against 102 losses while having the phenomenal record of having five teams ranked in the top ten final poll; more than any other coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Our speaker is a very academic individual. He was an honor student at Granby High School in Norfolk and he made the Dean's List at Duke University where he received his undergraduate degree. Coach Driesell also holds his Masters Degree from William and Mary College and is a member of the Beta Gamma Sigma Honorary at Maryland and is listed in the Who's Who in the South.

Starting his career as a Junior Varsity Basketball Coach in Norfolk, Virginia he continued on to become the head basketball coach at Newport News High School in Norfolk where he compiled a record of 59 consecutive wins. At this time he was chosen as the new basketball boss at Davidson College and he turned this small school into a national power. Seemingly, overnight, Davidson became the darling of many collegiate fans since "Lefty" demonstrated to the nation that a small college could play major league basketball.

The Ohio Valley Athletic Conference is justly proud of Coach Driesell's efforts and wish him and the University of Maryland continued success. We are indeed honored in having Coach Driesell with us this evening and hope that he enjoys his brief stay in the Ohio Valley.

CARLIN DODRILL

1931 Graduate of Follansbee High School. He attended West Liberty Co graduated in 1935. He now holds an M.A. Degree from the University of West Va.

Began his coaching career at Follansbee High School in 1936 and remained when they consolidated to make Brooke High School. From 1969 until the present served as Director of Athletics at Brooke.

He has 33 years as a coach and director of athletics. Mr. Dodrill received the Dan Achievement Award in 1972.

EDWARD GARDA

Born in Aliquippa, Pa. and graduating from the same high school, Mr. Garda Geneva College. He latter attended West Va. University where he secured his M.A.

After six years of teaching and coaching in Pennsylvania, he came to St. Clairsville High School as head football coach. He held this post for 11 years, having three undefeated teams. In his time his squads won 21 straight football games.

Mr. Garda has 38 years in education all of which he has served the last 12 as principal at Bellair High School. Mr. Garda is presently president of the Board of Directors of the Principals Association.

ROBERT ROE

A Warwood High School graduate of 1926, he attended Bethany College from 1926 to 1930. Returning to Warwood where he coached for 10 years, then to Wheeling High for 24 years. He attended West Liberty College for the past nine years. Mr. Roe has 43 total years in education and holds his M.A. from the U. of Pittsburgh.

He is a former director of the Ohio-West Va. All Star Football Game, the president of the Ohio Valley Bd. of Basketball Officials and past chairman of the Injury Clinic Program.

Bob also served for 23 years as track coach at Wheeling High winning three Ohio State Championships. At West Liberty College he won back to back football Championships in 1971 and in 1972. For this effort he was chosen West Va. Conference Coach of the Year in succession. During this period he took West Liberty to two National Championships.
