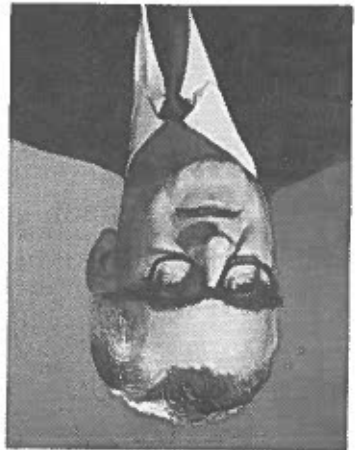

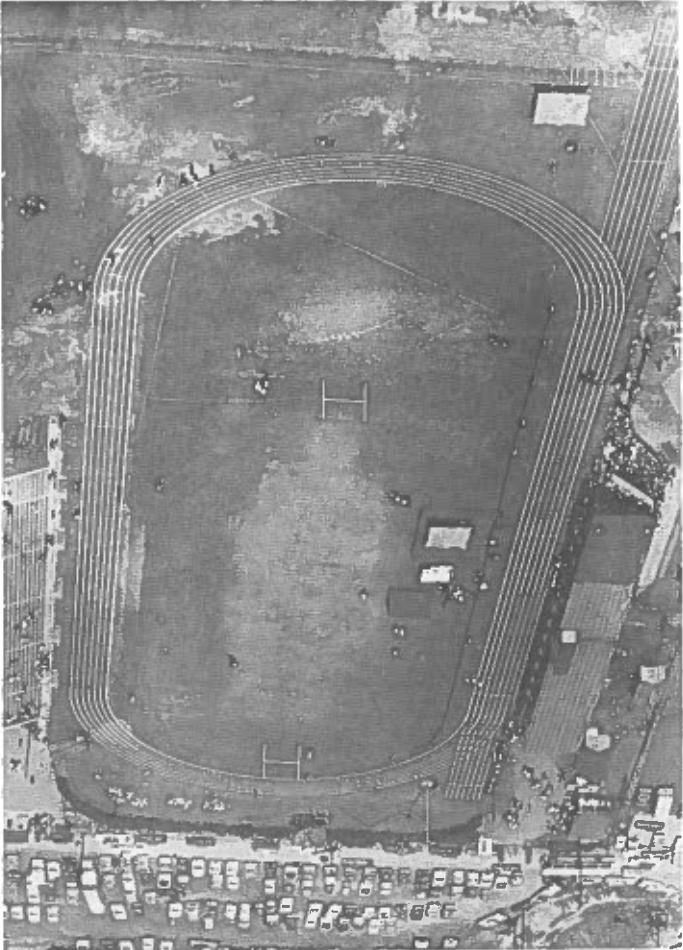

Aerial View of All Weather Track at Nelson Field

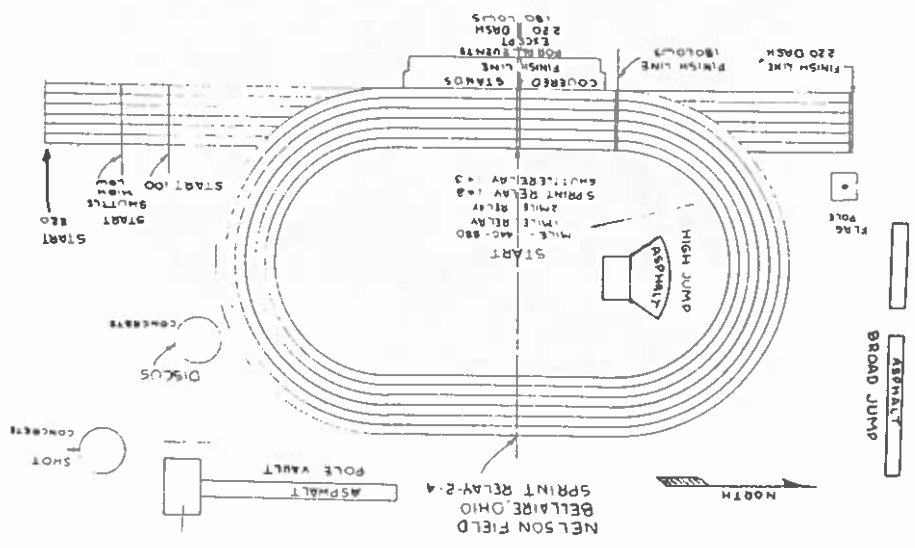

LOCATION: Nelson Field - 26th Street, Bellaire, Ohio

TRACK: All Weather 440 yards with 220 yard straight away.

Track has been resurfaced and all Field Events have been moved in front on stands.

SCORING: Six places will count 10 - 8 - 6 - 4 - 2 - 1.

SPIKES: One fourth of one inch maximum.

The area adjacent to the finish line will be fenced off and contestants found in this area will cause his teammates to be disqualified. The finish line officials must have a good view at all times.

A medical tent will be located at the North End of the field and available to all teams. This area will be supervised and directed by Dr. Thomas Ring along with a competent staff.

All relays will be run against time.

Relay Exchanges: The 880 yard sprint relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In all other relays, the California exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position of the incoming runner.

Restrictions: Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile cannot take part in more than one other track event. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events.

Shot put and discus will be thrown from cement. All other field event areas are of asphalt. Soft rubber shoes or ¼ inch spikes acceptable.

The shot put and discus will be run in flights according to the best distances. All schools entering teams in our relays must abide by the rules and regulations adopted by their State Associations.

HOUSING

Visiting teams coming over 150 air miles will be provided lodging in private homes. We are sorry but we must limit lodging to the first 25 teams, therefore, it is to your advantage to send in your entry blank early. Housing requests must be postmarked no later than April 16, 1974. All later applications will not be accepted. A maximum of 25 per team will be accommodated. Your team will be fed upon arrival on Friday, your boys will be entertained as our special guests that night in a variety of different ways. They will be given their breakfast on Saturday morning and then transported to the stadium. Meal at the Cafeteria - 50¢.

HEADQUARTERS

Bellaire High School Gym-Auditorium located at 35th & Belmont Sts., Bellaire, Ohio. Ample room for car and bus parking.

ENTRY FEE

There will be an entry fee of 50 cents for each boy that is entered in the meet. Checks for the total amount should be made to the Bellaire Relays Committee & enclosed with your official entry blank.

Coaches & Administrators will be guests of the Big Reds Touch-Club at a smoker in the Elks Club.

For the second straight year the Bellaire Relays produced a triple winner and again he was from West Virginia. In 1972, it was Tom Reid of Beckley who pulled the feat but last year the show belonged to Mike Tyson of the Charleston, W. Va. Mountain Lions. Tyson won the 100 in 9.8 seconds, the 220 in 21.8 seconds and the long jump with a 22 foot 10 1/4 inch effort. He also ran a leg on the sprint relay team which finished second. Together with some fine help from his reammates, Tyson led his team to the Relays Championship becoming the first West Virginia school to do this. Although not setting any records on the track, Tyson did establish an individual high scoring record with 32 points. He thus outscored all but three of the 75 teams entered. The 72 points scored by his team was also a record. This past fall he was a member of the Iowa State Cyclone football team where he played halfback. The Bellaire Relays wishes to congratulate Mike and wish him good luck in the future.

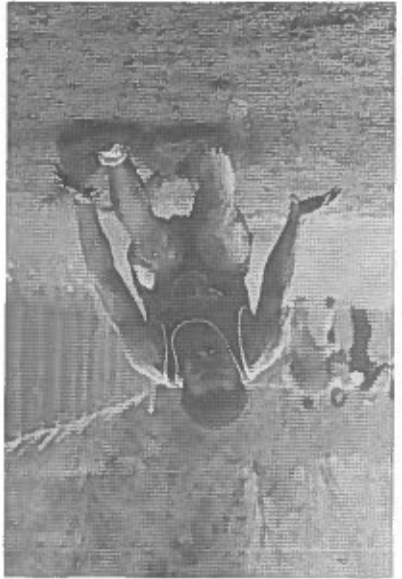

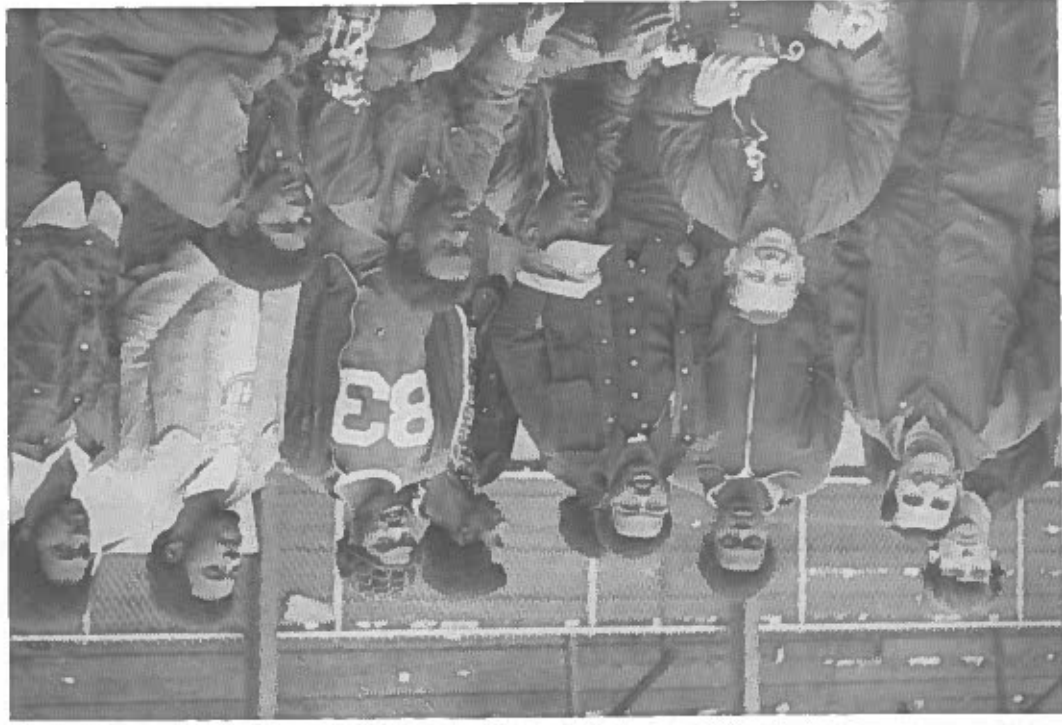
