COACH JIM CARLEN

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH, UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA

Jim Carlen, who had played his college football at Georgia Tech, had come to West Virginia University in 1966 after eight years on the Yellow Jackets staff. Within four years he took a program that had been sagging and built it to a point where in 1969 the Mountaineers enjoyed a 10 - 1 season, with the only loss being to arch rival Penn State. However, after WVU's victory over South Carolina in the Peach Bowl, the Cookeville, Tennessee native moved on to Texas Tech, where he fashioned bowl teams in four of five seasons.

At Morgantown, WVU was only 3-5-2 in Carlen's first year at the helm but went 5-4-1 in '67 and 7-3 in '68. The 10-1 record in '69 was the school's best since the unbeaten 1922 campaign.


At Texas Tech, located at Lubbock, Carlen's Raiders went 8-3 in his first season and earned a berth in the Sun Bowl. He was selected as Southwest Conference "Coach of the Year".

After slumping to only four victories in 11 starts in '70, the Raiders bounced back to go 8-3 in '72 and again earn a Bowl invitation. In '73, Carlen's team was 10-1 during the season, with the only loss being to Texas, and went on to best Tennessee in the Gator Bowl. He was named Southwest Conference "Coach of the Year" for the second time. He was also picked as NCAA District Seven "Coach of the Year" and Fellowship of Christian Athletes "Coach of the Year".

This past season, the Raiders were 6-4-1 and went to the Peach Bowl where they played to a tie with Vanderbilt. Again, Carlen made a move after a Peach Bowl appearance, this time to the University of South Carolina where he became head football coach and associate director of athletics.

The Ohio Valley Athletic Conference salutes Jim Carlen and certainly wish him well at the University of South Carolina.
