
Bud graduated from Bellaire High in 1938 where he was a member of the track and tennis teams. He then entered the Marine Corps and served in World War II with duty in the Central Pacific. After he was discharged he went to college at Ohio Northern before transferring to Kent State where he graduated in 1949. His first coaching job was at Bellaire where he was head track coach for seven years. He started the first cross country team at the school. He left Bellaire in 1957 and went to Martins Ferry serving as an assistant track coach for nine years.

In the intervening years he obtained his master's degree from W.V.U. and was a full time instructor at Ohio University Belmont County. In 1968 he took the position of director at the Belmont County Vocational School. He left there in 1974 to become director of the new Monroe County Vocational School.

The Relays is extremely grateful for what Bud has done. His contributions to education and athletics have been immeasurable. We are very proud to say that he is one of our own.

This year the BELLAIRE RELAYS is honoring its founder, Charles Bud Kyeser, as its Honorary Referee.




Aerial View of All Weather Track at Nelson Field

LOCATION: Nelson Field - 26th Street, Bellaire, Ohio

TRACK: All weather 440 yards with 220 yard straight away. Track was resurfaced in 1974 and all field events were moved in front of stands.

SCORING: Six places will count 10 - 8 - 6 - 4 - 2 - 1.

SPIKES: One fourth of one inch maximum.

RESTRICTIONS: The area adjacent to the finish line will be fenced off and contestants found in this area will cause his teammates to be disqualified. The finish line officials must have a good view at all times.

RELAY EXCHANGES: The 880 yard sprint relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In all other relays, the California exchange batons in the middle of the track.

SHOT PUT AND DISCUS: Shot put and discus will be run in inches spikes acceptable. Areas are of asphalt. Soft rubber shoes or $\frac{1}{4}$ inch spikes acceptable.

THROWING: The shot put and discus will be run in flights according to the best distances. All schools entering teams in our relays must abide by the rules and regulations adopted by their State Associations.

FIELD EVENTS: The shot put and discus will be run in field events. All other field events

more than one other track event. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events.

POSITIONS: Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile cannot take part in the mile in coming runner.

RELAYS: All relays will be run against time.

MEDICAL FUND: A medical tent will be located at the North End of the field and available to all teams. This area will be supervised and directed by Dr. Thomas Ring along with a competent staff.


HEADQUARTERS




