





# Warren Pugh Honorary Referee




Honorary Referee for the 1976 Bellaire Relays is one of the Ohio Valley's legendary sports figures, Warren "Nookie" Pugh of Wheeling. Now 74 years old, Warren Pugh has won the esteem and affection of people throughout the Ohio Valley as an athlete, official, and coach. He has also become widely known as a man of remarkable good will and humor and as a story-teller who can convulse banquet audiences. Warren was a star athlete at Linsly Institute and played his college football at Davis and Elkins under Cam Henderson. He was president of the student body at D. & E. and elected the most popular boy on campus.

Mr. Pugh served as Wheeling city recreation director for 15 years, was an Ohio County commissioner, and served as sheriff of Ohio County for two terms. An outstanding swimmer and diver in A.A.U. meets in his youth, he coached Linsly Institute to 27 straight Ohio Valley Athletic Conference swimming titles.

During his officiating career, he was recognized as extremely competent and a man of highest integrity. He officiated in the first night football game in the Ohio Valley. He also officiated the first West Virginia Intercollegiate basketball tournament in 1935. Now retired from officiating these sports, he remains active as a track and field official.

The Bellaire Relays is proud to honor Warren and thank him for his contributions to the Ohio Valley sports scene over the years.

**LOCATION:** Nelson Field - 26th Street, Bellaire, Ohio

**TRACK:** All weather 440 yards with 220 yard straight away. Track was resurfaced in 1974 and all field events were moved in front of stands.

**SCORING:** Six places will count 10 - 8 - 6 - 4 - 2 - 1.

**SPIKES:** One fourth of one inch maximum.

The area adjacent to the finish line will be fenced off and contestants found in this area will cause his teammates to be disqualified. The finish line officials must have a good view at all times.

A medical tent will be located at the North End of the field and available to all teams. This area will be supervised and directed by Dr. Thomas Ring along with a competent staff.

All relays will be run against time.

**Relay Exchanges:** The 880 yard sprint relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In all other relays, the California exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position of the incoming runner.

**Restrictions:** Any boy who runs the 880 or the mile cannot take part in more than one other track event. The relays shall be counted as track events. No boy can compete in more than four events of which only three can be track events.

Shot put and discuss will be thrown from cement. All other field event areas are of asphalt. Soft rubber shoes or 3/4 inch spikes acceptable.

The shot put and discuss will be run in flights according to the best distances. All schools entering teams in our relays must abide by the rules and regulations adopted by their State Associations.

## HOUSING

Visiting teams coming over 150 air miles will be provided lodging in private homes. We are sorry but we must limit lodging to the first 15 teams, therefore, it is to your advantage to send in your entry blank early. Housing request must be postmarked no later than April 13, 1976. All later applications will not be accepted. A maximum of 25 per team will be accommodated. Your team will be fed upon arrival at the school cafeteria at a charge of \$1.00 a meal and will be entertained as our special guest that night in a variety of different ways. They will be given their breakfast on Saturday Morning and then transported to the stadium.

## HEADQUARTERS

Bellaire High School Gym-Auditorium located at 35th and Belmont Sts., Bellaire, Ohio. Ample room for car and bus parking.

## ENTRY FEE

There will be an entry fee of \$1.00 for each boy that is entered in the meet. Checks for the total amount should be made to the Bellaire Relays Committee and enclosed with your official entry blank.

Coaches and Administrators will be guests of the Big Reds Touch-Club at a smoker in the Elks Club.




