



MARILYN VAN DERBUR

Marilyn Van Derbur has proven herself a television and radio personality and an accomplished speaker.

After having been selected Miss America and serving in that capacity for a year, she returned to the University of Colorado and graduated with PHI BETA KAPPA honors.

Since that time, she has been the hostess of 23 network television specials on CBS and NBC.

An avid sportswoman, she has competed in national AAU swimming meets, broken and trained her own horses, and competitively raced for the University of Colorado's ski team.

Marilyn is in great demand as a keynote convention speaker. She is presently the only woman who is a guest lecturer for General Motors.

In 1969 Marilyn addressed over 250,000 teenagers in high school assemblies from Maine to California. This involvement convinced her of the need there is for motivational work with youth. In addition to her adult speaking commitments, she devoted 3 years to creating, writing, teaching, and evaluating a mini-course for the public schools. So many principals and teachers requested the course, she formed the MARILYN VAN DERBUR MOTIVATIONAL INSTITUTE which is now releasing films and cassettes for use within the classroom.

During the past 12 years, she has spoken to thousands of business and educational groups. She addressed the National Association of Secondary School Principals for 3 consecutive years, the National Association of Elementary Principals for 2 consecutive years, and the National Catholic Education Association. TODAY'S EDUCATION magazine did a feature article on her motivational mini-course in 1974 and a follow-up story in September 1976.

She is a former member of the President's Advisory Council on Adult Education.

Marilyn was named "OUTSTANDING WOMAN SPEAKER IN AMERICA" recently. 30,000 questionnaires were sent out to corporate and civic meeting planners asking whom they considered to be the finest woman speaker in America.

OVAC Special Honoree DR. HAROLD A. MYER



Harold A. Meyer was born in Erie, Pennsylvania on July 6, 1911. He received his Bachelor's degree from Ohio University, his Masters from Ohio State University, and his Doctorate from the University of Pittsburgh.

While in high school and college he participated in football, basketball, track, swimming, and water polo.

Dr. Meyer has served as a teacher, a coach, a principal, a superintendent, and as Commissioner of the OHSAA.

In March of 1949, he assumed the duties as Principal of the Martins Ferry High School, becoming the Superintendent of Schools on July 1, 1950. He remained as Superintendent of the Martins Ferry Schools until his appointment as Assistant Commissioner of the OHSAA.

Harold served for 12 years on the Eastern District Board of Control as the representative of Class B schools. He acted as President and Secretary during his tenure. From 1958 through 1960 Dr. Meyer was a member of the State Board of Control serving as Vice-President during the year 1960. In June of 1960 at the National Federation Meeting at Glacier Park he became the first Ohio representative on the Federation Executive Committee.

Dr. Meyer has served as the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations since 1963. In 1965, he was appointed to the U.S. Olympic Committee-Women's Track and Field for the 1968 Olympic Games and again served in the same capacity for the 1972 Olympic Games.

OHIO VALLEY ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Ohio Valley Athletic Conference was organized in 1943 with F. W. Bowen, J. E. Ewing, J. C. Greer, M. S. Hattala, B. G. Lockhart, J. V. Nelson, C. Petty, C. F. Walker, and C. S. Wiseman among those responsible for its basic inception. Mr. C. S. Wiseman became the Conference's first president.

A demand arose in 1943 for a conference which would help stimulate and promote a more lucrative program of competitive high school athletics in the Upper Ohio Valley.

Today, the O.V.A.C. is the largest and most functional high school Conference of its kind in either Ohio or West Virginia. A total of ten major athletic programs are enjoyed by its member schools of which 46 schools supply the Upper Ohio Valley with over 6,500 athletes in the various competitive athletic areas.

It is the basic objective of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference to continue the promotion of all high school athletics and to serve in the over all development of proper school relationship, scholarship and sportsmanship within the Conference.

BOB ROE Calvin J. J. Giffin Memorial Track Award

Coach Roe spent 44 years as a football coach 43 of them as a head coach. (11 years at Warwood, 24 years at Wheeling, and 9 years at West Liberty State College.) Bob's football record was 232 wins - 146 loses with 38 ties. His teams were conference Champs in 1970 and 1971, which won him Coach of the Year honors. His teams also won nine City Championships. His 1970 team was undefeated and his 1971 team lost one game by forfeit.

Coach Roe was Track coach at Warwood for 3 years Wheeling for 23 years, and West Liberty for 2 years. While coaching track he had 20 regional Championships, One State Championship, and One Undefeated team.

Bob served as Game Director for the All-Star Football Game from 1946 through 1960.

Many of his players have made it in the professional ranks and many were chosen as N.A.I.A. All-Americans.
