
The dinner, which begins at 7 p.m., also will be highlighted by the presentation of awards to the team winners of all the conference's fall sports programs

Slaughter is a native of Ironton, O. He holds a B.S. degree in education from Capital University and obtained


his Master's Degree from Marshall University in 1956. Prior to attending college, Slaughter spent two years in the U.S. Navy.

He launched his coaching career a South Point (0.) High School, where he stayed for two seasons, 1950 and '51, He then coached at Jackson, O. through 1956 and was head coach at Warren Harding from 1957 through 1959. After leaving Harding he spent two years as an assistant at Ohio State and moved to Capital as head coach in 1962

Slaughter's record as a high school coach was 83-17-3. While at Capital he has turned in 77 victories against 53 losses and two ties

He was named Ohio High School Coach of the Year in 1957 and Ohio College Coach of the Year in 1970, His 1970 Capital University Crusaders were NCAA College Division cham-pions as well as NCAA Stagg Bowl winners

Slaughter and his wife, Peggy, have three children— Gwendolyn Ann, Lisa Kaye and Scott Eugene. They reside at 891 Vernon Road in Bexley, near Columbus.
