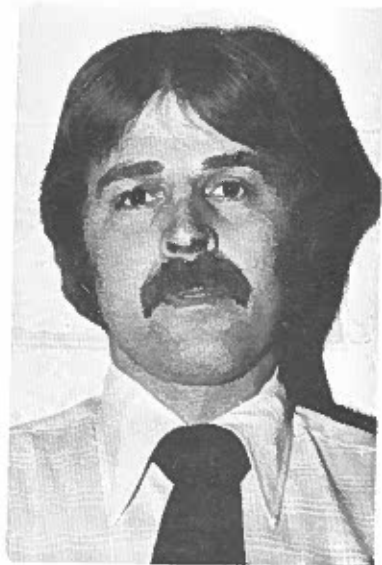

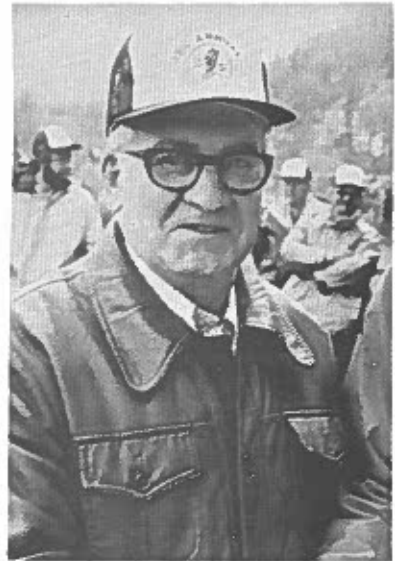

Joe is here at Nelson Field today for the Bellaire Relays, but he is not in appearance the same Joe Andry who set a Relays' mile record at 4:21.1 when he ran in 1967 for Cleveland St. Joe, coming down to Bellaire from the upper part of the state where for four years he had been one of the top, if not the top, distance men in Ohio.

Today's Joe Andry is shy one of the legs that powered him to the 1967 record, and one of the eyes that helped him gauge the field, to determine at what stage of the race he had to pour it on and kill off the competition.

Both the leg and the eye he lost in Vietnam two years after he ran in the Relays. When he left St. Joe, he went on to Cleveland State University, and he was good enough there to be selected as the school's most outstanding cross country runner.

He didn't get to finish at CSU; the Vietnam War was taking a whole bunch of young people and turning their lives inside out, and Joe was one of them. On August 29, 1969, Joe was on a reconnaissance with an infantry patrol near Lai Khe when he tripped a booby-trap wire, and three days later, when he woke up in a hospital in Japan, the right eye was gone, his left leg was gone, an arm was nerve-damaged, and both upper and lower jaws were broken, in addition to assorted other shrapnel wounds.

Fourteen months later, Joe was out of the convalescence and rehabilitation routines at the Valley Forge General Hospital, and he had learned to live with and to function well on his artificial leg.

That was the make-or-break point. He had two ways to go.

No, one way, really. Vietnam had changed his physical appearance, but what was inside of him hadn't been touched; the inside stuff of determination and courage and dedication and guts, the bottom line.

So, Joe Andry started putting his life back together, in the way he had lived it up to Vietnam. He went back to St. Joe to help coach the Viking distance men, and he did a good job, not only in the coaching end of it, but in showing the kids that adversity was a matter of mind that posed no obstacle to anyone who had dedication and determination and guts. That, Joe Andry was a living example of, and some of it rubs off on everybody who is familiar with his story, which, simply told, is you got to believe in yourself.

Joe Andry isn't coaching anymore. He is the assistant to the state director for veterans employment, an arm of the U.S. Department of Labor's Veterans Employment Service. He is still winning awards — except this time for outstanding work instead of outstanding running.

Here today at Nelson Field, Joe Andry may be reliving that afternoon 13 years ago when he came home in front of the field in record time. He might remember that slim, crew-cut kid in the St. Joe track shirt, and he might be proud of him.

But Joe Andry can be even more proud of what that kid has become — an example to everyone of us that nothing bad can happen if you keep on believing in yourself.

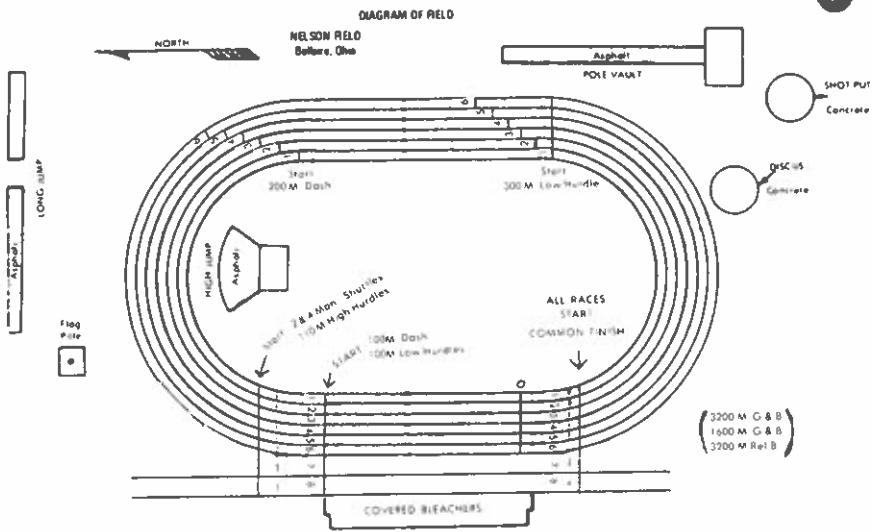

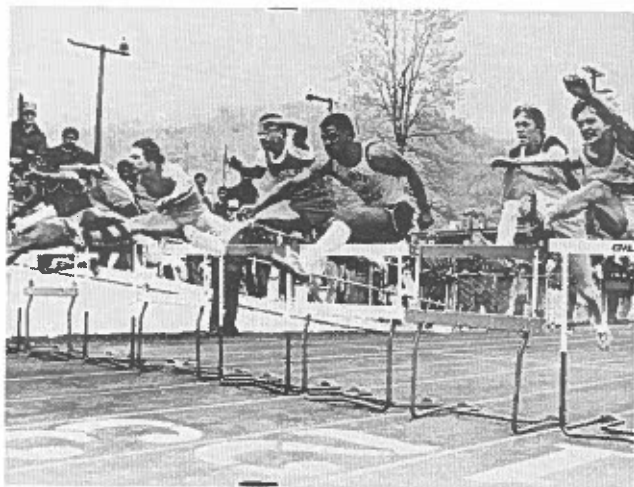
