Edward "Pie" Sherwood goes back a long way in the athletic tradition of Bellaire High School. A native of Bellaire, Pie was one of the Big Reds outstanding athletes in the years prior to his graduation in 1937.

He played right half and quarterback for Bellaire High grid teams, becoming the second highest scoring back in the Valley in the 1936 season. On the basketball team he was a guard, and in track he handled the shot put, discus, and javelin, the latter no longer used in high school competition. In the track season of 1937, he set an Eastern Ohio shot put record which stood for 13 years.

Pie also played first base for three years with the Bellaire High softball team which won the Ohio Valley High School League Championship all three of those years. He was also a member of the Big Reds grid squad which played the first football game at Nelson Field, after the Reds moved down from the old Riverview Park.

After he was graduated from high school, Pie spent 35 years as a volunteer, coaching Big Reds in discus and shot put, and was an active member of the Big Reds Touchdown Club from the time it started until his health interfered a few years ago. In fact, he was a member of the committee that steered the combining of the Big Reds Booster Club and the Touchdown Club into a single organization under the name of the present Big Reds Touchdown Club.

Pie and his wife, the former June Schramm, who was a cheerleader at the old St. John's High School, had three sons who starred in athletics at Bellaire High School, including Mike, the present Big Reds grid coach, Russell, and Kelly. They also have a daughter, Mary Lynn Musilli.

The Relays Committee's choice of Edward "Pie" Sherwood as honorary referee for the 1981 Bellaire Relays could not have fallen on a more deserving person whose contributions to his high school and his community mark him as an outstanding example of the Big Reds spirit and tradition.

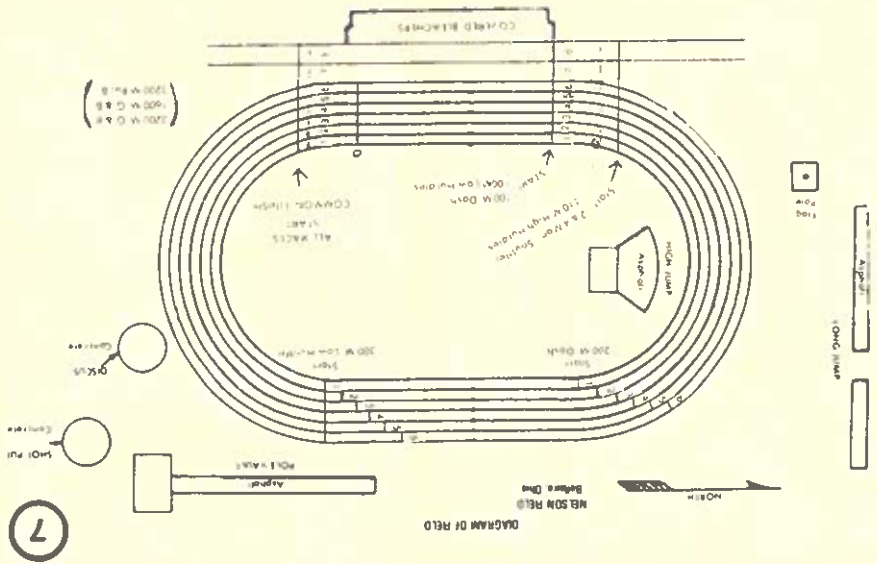

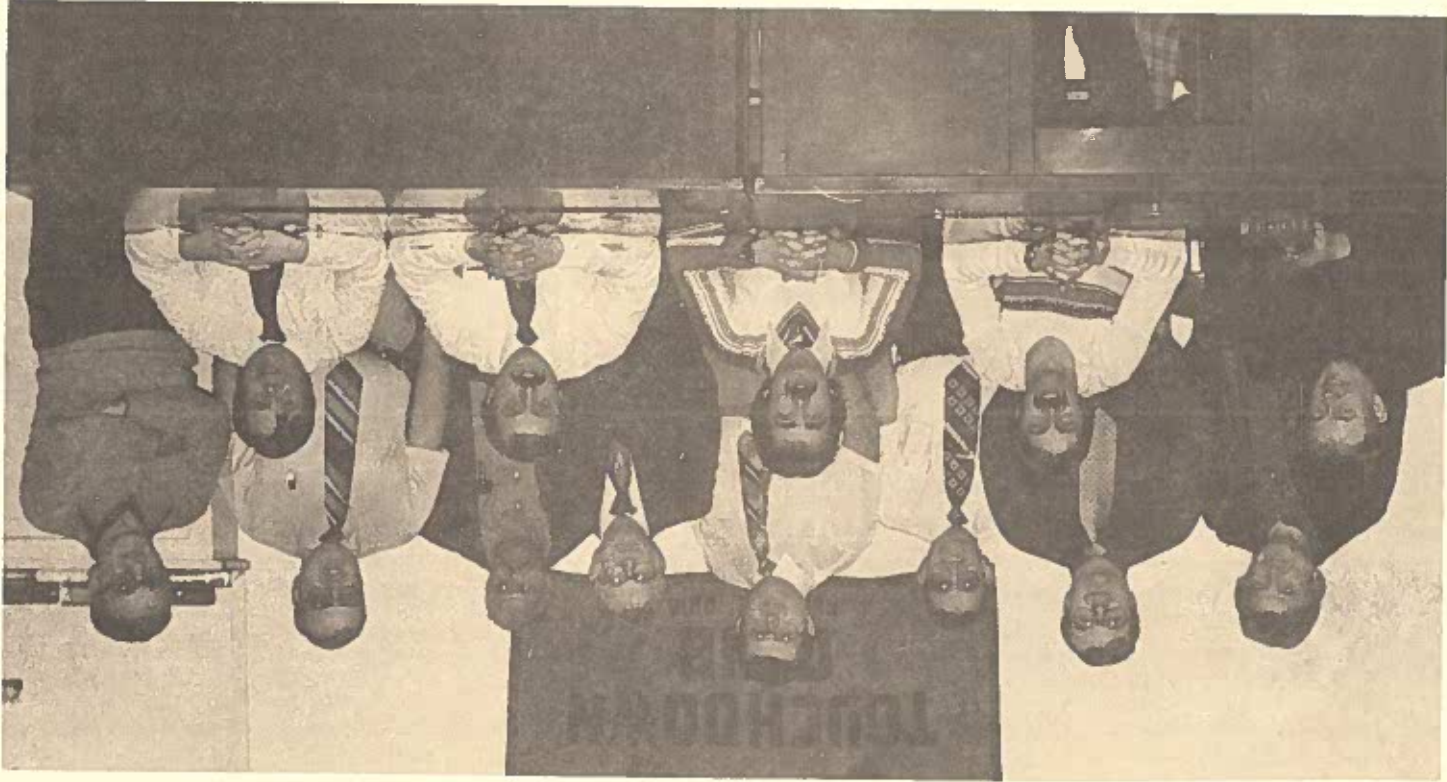
