Our Guest Speaker Coach Rick Huckabay

Marshall University Head Basketball Coach Rick Huckabay is in his first year as a collegiate head coach. It has already been a successful year for the rookie as he was recently named as the "Southern Conference Coach of the Year" by the Southern Conference Sports Media Association. Huckabay's team made it a consensus opinion that he is the premier coach in the league as they swept three games in the Southern Conference Tournament to earn Marshall its first NCAA bid in 12 years.

Marshall has shown a permanent-press defense that has forced turnovers by the score and the tenacious defense has produced a 25-5 record, the most victories in 37 years for a Marshall team.

Huckabay's charisma and a winning basketball program has spurred the Huntington fans to flock to three year old Henderson Center in record numbers. Over 131,000 spectators filled the Henderson Center in 15 games.

Huckabay's openness with the media has been nothing short of controversial especially when he blasted the league's officials. Sports writers were accommodated at every turn by Huckabay and were never at a loss for a story around the former Louisiana State University assistant coach.

Huckabay's pretty wife, Kaye, has also been the object of considerable media attention.

While Huckabay was assistant to Dale Brown at LSU, the Tigers compiled 90 wins and just 30 losses. LSU visited the final four of the NCAA Tournament in 1981 and played in the NIT twice in Huckabay's four years at the Louisiana school.

Prior to taking the assistant's position at LSU, Huckabay was a phenomenally successful high school coach in Louisiana. At Rapides and Redemptorist High Schools, Huckabay won 310 games and lost only 53. Four times he was named the state's "High School Coach of the Year." His Redemptorist teams won the state championship in 1977 and 1978. His Rapides team captured the state crown in 1973.

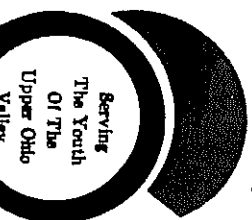

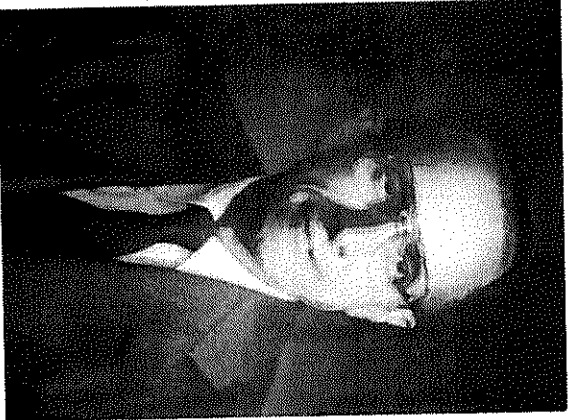

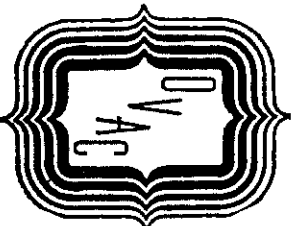

The Ohio Valley Athletic Conference was organized in 1943 with F. W. Bowen, J. E. Ewing, J. C. Greer, M. S. Hattala, B. G. Lockhart, J. V. Nelson, C. Petty, C. F. Walker and C. S. Wiseman among those responsible for its basic inception. Mr. C. S. Wiseman became the Conference's first president.

A demand arose in 1943 for a conference which would help stimulate and promote a more lucrative program of competitive high school athletics in the upper Ohio Valley.

Today, the O.V.A.C. is the largest and most functional high school conference of its kind in either Ohio or West Virginia. A total of ten major athletic programs are enjoyed by its member schools of which 47 schools supply the upper Ohio Valley with over 10,000 athletes in the various competitive athletic areas.

It is the basic objective of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference to continue the promotion of all high school athletics and to serve in the overall development of proper school relationship, scholarship and sportsmanship within the Conference.
