ROBERT LEE "SAM" HUFF

Sam Huff was a former W.V.U. All-American and six-time all-pro in the N.F.L., while playing linebacker for the New York Giants and Washington Redskins. He was the No. 3 draft choice of the Giants in 1956, and within three years he was named the league's most valuable defensive player.

In 1959, Mr. Huff was selected as West Virginian of the Year.

He has been the subject of a CBS Television News feature entitled "The Violent World of Sam Huff" and has authored a book titled "Defensive Football".

Sam was elected to the West Virginia Sports Writers' Hall of Fame in 1976, and is also a member of the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame.

On August 7, 1982, Sam Huff was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton.

He is currently vice president of Marriott Hotels & Resorts and is a color analyst for the Redskins on WMAL Radio in Washington, D.C.

Sam is married to Farmington native, Mary Fletcher, and they have three children - Sam, Jr., Cathy, and J.D. (Joe).

GENE "BEEF" LAMONE

The introduction of Sam Huff will be done by a longtime friend and W.V.U. teammate Gene Lamone.

Gene is himself a former football All-American and WVU team captain in 1955.

"Beef" is a native of Wellsburg, W.Va., where he was an all-stater in football and participated in the West Virginia - Ohio All-Star Game. Following his collegiate days at WVU, he went on to play two seasons for the Philadelphia Eagles.

From 1957 until 1965, Gene was football coach at Linsly. Currently he is vice president of Sales and Marketing for Capitol Manufacturing in Columbus.

He and his wife (Marion Sayre of Wellsburg) are the parents of three children - Kelly, Brad, and Jill.

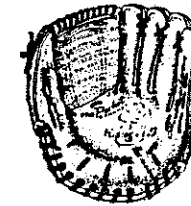

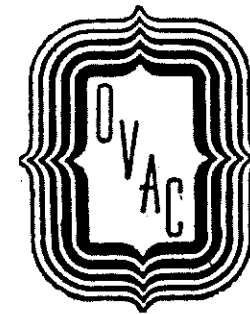
