



PROFILE OF ARCHIE GRIFFIN

Archie Griffin, former captain of the Cincinnati Bengals, and recently named to the College National Football Foundation Hall of Fame, has won virtually all the top honors any single athlete could win in college football.

Griffin is the only two time winner of the prestigious Heisman Trophy, symbolic of "The Outstanding College Football Player in the Country." He was a three time All-American in 1973, 74 and 75. He was named "Most Valuable Football Player in the Big Ten" for two straight years, thereby becoming only the second athlete in history to accomplish this feat. He was named "College Football Player of the Year" by both United Press International and by the Sporting News.

Griffin broke nearly all the Ohio State rushing records. He set national marks and Big Ten marks, both for a single season and for a career. He also holds another rare distinction. He was named Captain of the 1974 Ohio State football team and his teammates renamed him to Captain of the 1975 Buckeyes.


Even before being acclaimed as college football's best player, Griffin was the darling of Ohio State fans. The love affair started on September 12, 1972, when Griffin, a freshman, came off the bench in the second game of the season to 27 times for a then school record of 239 yards against North Carolina. Griffin put new life into the Ohio State offense that rainy afternoon and at the same time won hinself a spot in the hearts of Buckeye fans everywhere. In four seasons, Griffin nushed for 5,496 yards, the most in Ohio State's history and the Big Ten. He holds the NCAA mark for average yards per cany (6.13) for those nunners with more than 785 carries. He ran for over 100 yards in 31 straight games, also a national record.

Griffin's remarkable debut was the beginning of one of the most successful eras in OSU football history. During the next four years, the Buckeyes would win 40 of 46 games, capture four Big Ten titles and play in four Rose Bowls. OSU narrowly missed the national championship in each of Archie's last three years.

In 1975, Griffin was a recipient of the NCAA's Top Five Award. The latter is the top honor an undergraduate can receive and is based on a combination of athletic skill, academic accomplishment, leadership and character. Graduating a quarter early, Griffin earned his college degree in industrial relations.


In 1976, he was a first round draft choice of the Cincinnati Bengals, playing with that franchise for eight years. As a professional, Archie continued his illustrious football career by ranking among the top NFL nushers with a 4.1 yards-per-carry average. He also commanded respect throughout the league as a very adept pass receiver.

Archie Griffin returned to his alma mater in March, 1984. He later accepted the position of Special Assistant to the Director in June of 1985. In July of 1987, he was named Assistant Director of Athletics. He will work in the area of fund raising and will represent the Director's office at various functions around the state and across the nation. Additionally, he will be involved in other special projects as they arise.




The Ohio Valley Athletic Conference was organized in 1943 with F.W. Brown, J.E. Ewing, J.C. Greer, M.S. Hattala, B.G. Lockhart, J.V. Nelson, C. Petty, C.F. Walker and C.S. Wiseman among those responsible for its basic inception. Mr. C.S. Wiseman became the Conference's first president.

A demand arose in 1943 for a conference which would help stimulate and promote a more lucrative program of competitive high school athletics in the upper Ohio Valley.

Today, the OVAC is the largest and most functional high school conference of its kind in either Ohio or West Virginia. A total of ten major athletic programs are enjoyed by its member schools of which 45 schools supply the upper Ohio Valley with over 10,000 athletes in the various competitive athletic areas.

It is the basic objective of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference to continue the promotion of all high school athletics and to serve in the overall development of proper school relationship, scholarship and sportsmanship within the Conference.




