BUD KEYSER - THE FOUNDER

Bud was head track coach at Bellaire in 1955 when he organized the first Bellaire Relays. That year the meet was composed of eleven teams but each year it grew larger and at present time there are over seventy teams in the Relays. It was through the efforts of Bud, who developed the Relays in those formative years and men like him, that the **BELLAIRE RELAYS** has grown to be the large and successful meet it is today.

Bud graduated from Bellaire High School in 1938 where he was a member of the track and tennis teams. He then entered the Marine Corps and served in World War II with duty in the Central Pacific.

After he was discharged he went to college at Ohio Northern before transferring to Kent State where he graduated in 1949.

His first coaching job was at Bellaire where he was head track coach for seven years. He started the first cross country team at the school. He left Bellaire in 1957 and went to Martins Ferry serving as an assistant track coach for nine years.

In the intervening years he obtained his master's degree from W.V.U. and was a full-time instructor at Ohio University, Belmont County. In 1968 he took the position of director at the Belmont County Joint Vocational School. He left there in 1974 to become director of the new Monroe County Vocational School.

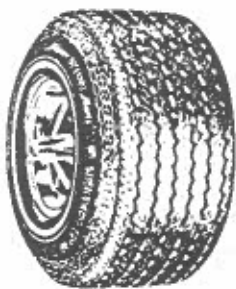

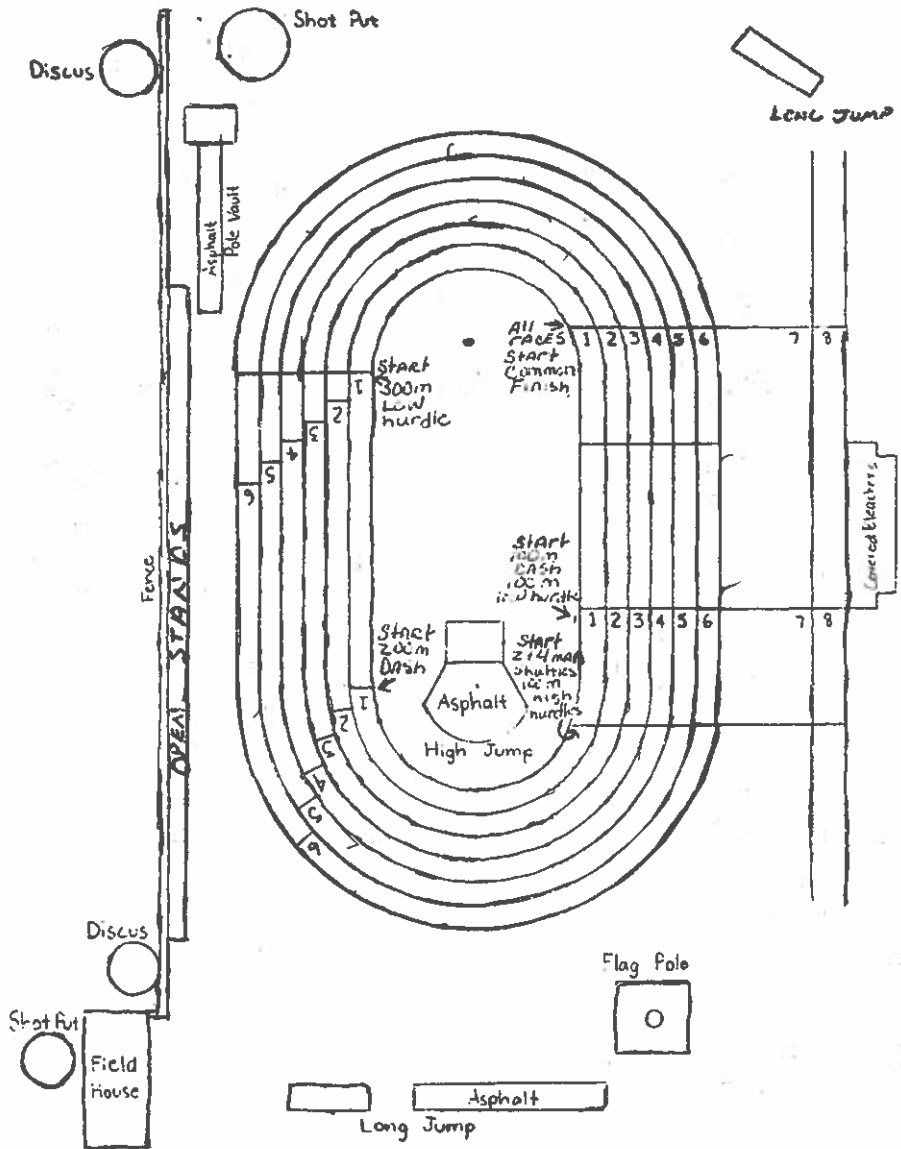
