STARTING IN THE FALL OF 1999

DIVISION 1 / DIVISION 2

Starting in the Fall of 1999 the OVAC will divide into two divisions and will be called <u>Division One</u> and <u>Division Two</u>. Teams will be divided based on their 1998 finish in the OVAC Tournament. At the end of the 1999 season the bottom two teams of the Division One will be dropped to the Second Division, and the top two teams in Division Two will be elevated to the First Division.

Please note: based on your finish, you will be <u>required</u> to play the other seven teams in your division before the tournament cutoff the following year. You can schedule, as many other games with whoever you want in this time period, but these seven games must be played or you will not qualify for the tournament. Absolutely no exceptions will be made to this rule or this concept will not work! This will also help your schedule making for the following year.

The tournament seedings will be as follows: the Division One teams will be seeded 1-8 depending on their regular season record against each other, then the Division Two teams will be seeded 9-16 based on their regular season record against each other. There will be only one Tournament Champion, but there will be two All-OVAC Teams, Two Players of the Year and Two Coaches of the Year selected. One for Division One and the same for Division Two in both the Men's and Women's groups based on the regular season record against others in their division.

The All-Conference choices will be based on the same selection criteria currently in place (Champion places four players, Second Place three players, Third & Fourth Place 2 players and all others 1 player with all schools placing two players on a Honorable Mention list), but will be based on the regular season and not the tournament.


