# West Virginia gets past Ohio in baseball

WHEELING - West Virginia came back strong after suffering a loss to the rival-state Buckeyes a year ago by delivering a 6-2 victory in the annual George Kovalick OVAC Baseball All-All Star Game at the J.B. Chambers Complex on Monday.

Weir's Michael Mills led-off the second inning by smashing a fastball 387feet over the left field wall and eight Mountaineers' pitchers pitched in to help earn the victory.

"Our pitching was excellent." West Virginia coach Tim Provenzano of Madonna said. "Everybody came in and did their job. It was unbelievable. Pitching truly wins games and Mills hitting a home run helps, too. He is a great player."

Wheeling Park's Jub Delbrugge earned the win by tossing a scoreless second inning with one strikeout in relief of starting pitcher, Austin Crebs of Wheeling, we really had fun in the dugout." Central

Crebs tossed a scoreless first and struck

out one, just four days after pitching in the state tournament.

"It has been a crazy week with all of the publicity and everything, Crebs said. "It is really an honor to be here pitching in my last high school game. I didn't know who was starting coming into the game but it is an honor to be named a starter."


The loss went to Southern Local's Domanick Michael, despite two punch outs in two frames.

Mills' homer put the Mountaineers on the board in the second and Oak Glen's Ty Logston added another run in the stanza with a RBI single to score Wheeling Central's Isaac Rine.

"Off the bat I thought that I flew out," Mills said. "I thought my hitting coach was going to be yelling at me from the stands but it went over the fence. Running the bases felt good after hitting one out in my last game.

"This is just a great group of guys and





"Pitching was outstanding on both sides," Ohio coach Mike Callopy of Edison said. "They just took advantage of more things than we did (Monday), but the All-Star Game is definitely more fun to watch when it is well played and competitive and this game was."

Bishops' coach Bob Kleeh was honored for collecting his 100th career win, while Callopy and Linsly's Jay Cartwright were recognized for their 200th career win.


"I am blessed to have really good assistant coaches and outstanding players," Callopy said. "It talks more towards the kids and coaches over the last several years."
