WELCOME



You Are And Will Be Missed. The OVAC Soccer Family

CHARLES "CHUCK" ROBINSON

September 8, 1948 September 20, 2018

It all happens so quickly. A blink of the eye. Not a chance to say thanks. A missed opportunity to tell someone how much you appreciate them. You'll do it later. And then the door slams shut.

On Sunday, Chuck and I set up soccer voting, talked about the season, joked about some stuff, and said we'll talk Wednesday when the nomination process closed. Tuesday comes a text that says I'm in the emergency room. I'll be in touch. Not certain if it's him, a family member, a friend. Next day his wife says he's in ICU. Wednesday his son says he had heart problems, but everything looked okay. Then Thursday you get the call. Chuck didn't make it. You talked Sunday, a week later you're sitting at his funeral still in disbelief. And you missed that opportunity to say anything.

Chuck was one of the best. The little general. He ran things his way, but ALWAYS with the best interest of the kids in mind. He stood firm when he had to, compromised when necessary, and gave in if it meant getting something better accomplished.

Josh Strope, sports editor of *The Intelligencer*, interviewed several veterans in the soccer community prior to his funeral. Here's a sampling.

"Soccer was always a part of him, whether it was as a coach, a referee, a referee instructor, you name it. Then he took over as OVAC director and took the Conference to a new level with the all-star games, making sure everything was in tip-top shape." -Joe Pepe, Brooke High School

"He brought me into the sport of soccer and into coaching. His advice, guidance, and support have made me a better coach." -Bob Kolanko, Madonna High School

"I got to know Chuck when I was a young player and then had a chance to start working with him when I started coaching with the Force Travel team, where once again he was heavily involved in the development of travel soccer. . . . His purpose was always for the kids." -Steve Kopcha, Steubenville Catholic Central High School

"Moving in from out of the area, Chuck quickly took me in as a mentee. His message in our OVAC meetings was for the good of the game. That meant for coaches and officials to work together for the benefit of the kids and the game." -Greg Bowers, Steubenville High School

"Chuck was 100% committed to the kids, and he put them first. Anything he thought was important, he tried to implement. I have the utmost respect for a man who would sacrifice his time for the betterment of soccer in the Ohio Valley. He meant so much to so many people. Coaches looked up to him for direction. Players looked up to him for his wisdom of the game." -Mario Julian, Wheeling Park High School.

"Chuck Robinson always encouraged all coaches to teach our students with integrity, and conduct our play in a manner that exemplified the highest ideals of the game and sportsmanship." -Carrie Hanna, Wheeling Park High School

"He was a good friend, and the Ohio Valley soccer scene has lost one of its biggest advocates. He will be missed by many, but his efforts to grow the game will live on." -Jay Adams, former soccer director

"At the end of the game, going through the line to shake hands, Chuck said 'Nice Goal, Josh.' It stuck out because most opposing coaches don't always acknowledge a goal scorer, let alone by name. But that was Chuck." -Josh Strope, sports editor


"The tournaments will run, because if they do not, it would be an insult to Chuck. They will always go on, but they won't go on as always." -Tom Rataiczak, Executive Director

SOCCER ALL-STAR MATCH

Effective 2018 - 2019

The boys' and girls' All-Star matches will be played on Sunday, November 11, 2018, at St. Clairsville High School.

Boys will play at 1:00PM. Girls will play at 3:30PM.

Voting for the All-Star Match will be done on line, according to the calendar in the right column.

Each coach may nominate **UP TO FIVE (5)** players for consideration. Nominations MUST BE SENIORS.

Girls who play on coed teams will be nominated for the girls match.

Once all nominations have be confirmed, a pallot of players will be returned to the coaches to rote for the players to represent their respective state.

Each team shall consist of nineteen (19) players for the game. NO SCHOOL MAY HAVE MORE THAN THREE PLAYERS.

Any senior selected as Player-of-the-Year MUST be in the All-Star Match.

COACHING ROTATION

Coaches for the game shall be selected from the class championship teams.

Should a coach decline, it will move to the class runner-up. From there, it will be determined by the final standings (3rd, 4th, etc.)

For 2018, the head coach will be from Class 5A, with assistants coming from 1A-3A and 4A.

For 2019, the head coach will be from Class 1A-3A, with assistants coming from 4A and 5A.

For 2020, the head coach will be from Class 4A, with assistants coming from 1A-3A and 5A.

For 2021, the head coach will be from Class 5A, with assistants coming from 1A-3A and 4A
