

In just two seasons, Torre has already broken the Union Local school record for career kills. She currently stands at 675.


"Torre is a fun kid, who is outgoing and always ready to laugh, but when the game starts, she puts that games on face on and takes no prisoners," Sechrest said.

Along with her All-Ohio accolade, Torre was named All-District 12 First Team, All-OVAC and All-Buckeye 8.

Casey, meanwhile, is also a standout as a hitter. She finished with 170 kills, 68 aces and a serving percentage of 96.2. She also had a kill percentage of 35.9.

"Casey is a team player, who is very focused and very smart," Sechrest said. "She's a student of the game who can spot her opponents' weaknesses and then tries to use that to her advantage. She's been a starter since she was a freshman and proved herself from day one. She's grown into a great leader. She's one who leads by example."

Casey's left her mark on UL volleyball in the record book, too. She actually holds the career record

for aces (254) and assists (1249).

Awards have been plentiful for Casey, too. She's already received District 12's Division III Player of the Year. She will take part in the D-12 and OVAC All-Star Matches.

Mattingly, the first Manager of the Year for the Marlins since Joe Girardi in 2006, was the AL MVP with the New York Yankees in 1985. He is fifth person to win both MVP and Manager of the Year.

"They're just different. The first one feels personal and this one feels more like a team thing," Mattingly said, "and that's why I'm proud of it because we've struggled for a couple years and for us to move forward is important, and I think this is a

sign that we're heading in that direction."
San Diego's Jayce Tingler finished second behind Mattingly in balloting by the BBWAA, followed by David Ross of the Chicago Cubs.

Tingler and Ross led their teams to the playoffs in their first seasons as a big league manager.

The Cy Young Awards will be announced by the BBWAA on Wednesday night, followed by the MVPs on Thursday.

After losing 105 games a year ago, Miami's 2020 season was nearly derailed by a coronavirus outbreak during the first weekend of play. The team had to make 174 roster moves but still managed the franchise's first winning record since 2009.

The steady hand of the 59-year-old Mattingly played a big role in the turnaround, which confinued in the playoffs. Miami eliminated the NL Central champion Cubs in the first round before it was swept by the Atlanta Braves in the NL Division Series.

Cash, who turns 43 on Dec. 6, hit .183 with 12 homers and 58 RBIs in 246 major league games as a catcher for five teams, including Tampa Bay. After his playing career ended, he worked as an advance scout for Texas and Toronto before joining Terry Francona's staff in Cleveland as the bullpen coach.

The Tampa, Florida, native and Florida State alum was hired as Tampa Bay manager the day before his 37th birthday. He finished third in balloting for AL Manager of the Year in each of the past two seasons. He is the franchise's first winner of

Mattingly guided the Marlins to their first playoff appearance since 2003 despite dealing with a COVID-19 outbreak that paused their season and ravaged the roster.
