The all-stars of Ohio Valley Athletic Conference wrestling shone brightly in the final chapter of the 2004 season, defeating Pennsylvania's Midwestern Athletic Conference's all-stars, 36-12, at the Brooke Fieldhouse Wednesday night.

The OVAC won 10 of 14 matches against its Keystone State counterpart; last season, the team comprised of wrestlers from Ohio and West Virginia won the dual, 45-12.

Buckeye Local's Jimmy Young set the tone in the meet's opening match, dismantling Montour's Mike Smith, 7-2, at 103 pounds. Anthony Valles of Weirton Madonna kept the ball rolling for the OVAC with a six-point win over Southside's Tom Cuneu at 112 pounds.
