

She plans on attending a four year college majoring in Athletic Training.




Aleasha Brandt Steubenville







Sarah is undecided on her college but is planning to pursue an engineering degree.





Amber plans to attend a four year college or university to major in physical therapy and sports medicine.



Brittany plans to attend Alderson-Broaddus College and become a Physician's Assistant.






Roger Clegg Magnolia
