

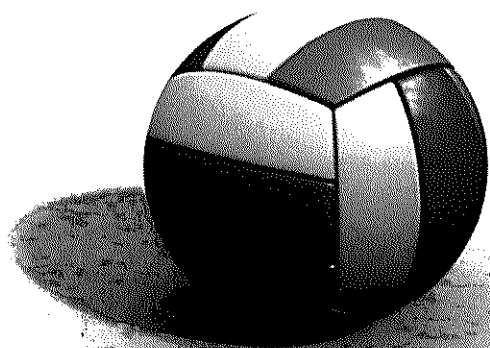

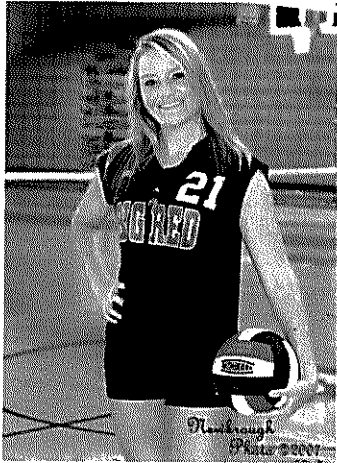

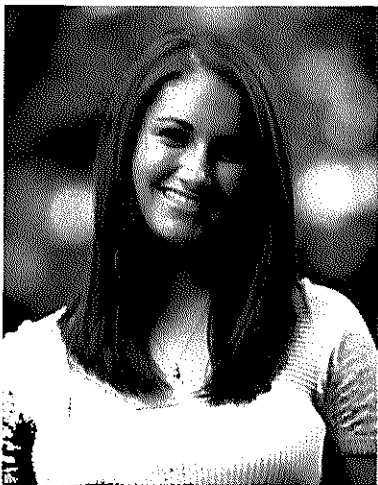

She plans to attend college and pursue a career in business or public relations.

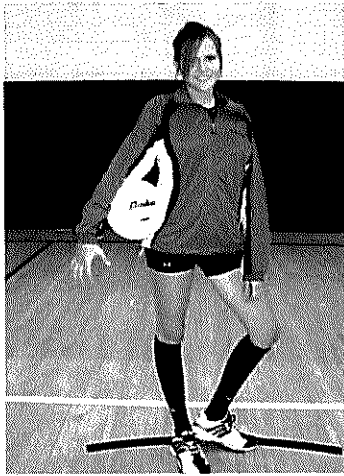

Lauren's future plans include attending college majoring in education, psychology or physical therapy. She is the daughter of Kim and Paul Zink.

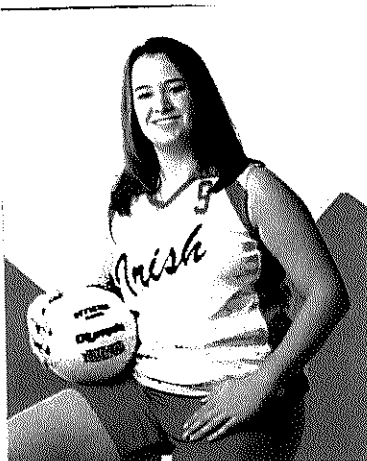

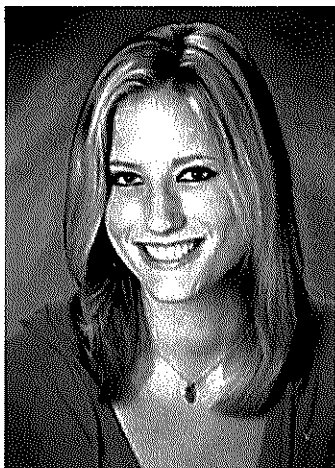

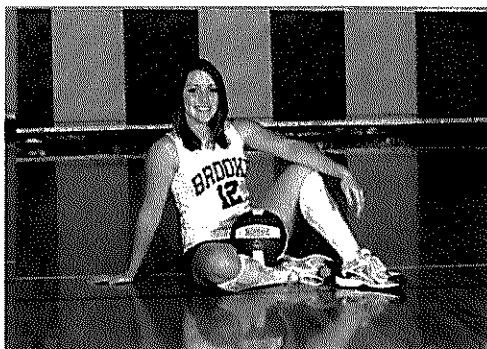

After graduation, Katy plans on attending Bethany College and majoring in Early Childhood Education.



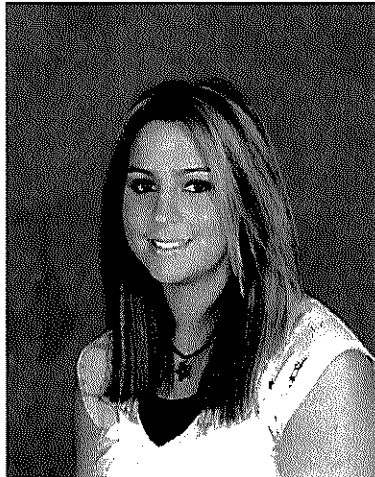

She plans to attend college and focus in the medical field and would like to continue with volleyball at the college level.

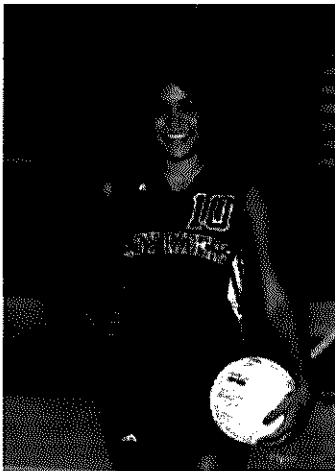
