Bill Hinegardner OVAC Duals Shadyside wins 1A/2A title

Steubenville upends Harrison Central for Class 4A championship

STEUBENVILLE - Just a mere 24 hours after being eliminated from the Ohio State Dual Meet Tournament, both Shadyside and Steubenville bounced back in convincing fashion Thursday

night.

The Tigers (1A/2A) and Big Red (4A) ruled their respective divisions as the OVAC Bill Hinegardner Dual Meet Championships wrapped up


inside Steubenville High Crimson School's Center.

Shadyside, under the direction of head coach Scott Kinemond, rolled past Toronto (62-15) in the semifinals before defeating Steubenville Central (48-23) in the

Steubenville, meanwhile, ran away from Martins Ferry (57-12) and Harrison Central (63-9) in winning its title.

"I'm really happy with the way we wrestled tonight," an elated Kinemond said. "This (the title) is a long time coming. We finally have a nearly full team. The kids have stepped it up every week."

When asked if he was worried about his team bouncing back from the loss to Amanda Clearcreek, Kinemond quickly said, "Maybe a little bit, but these kids have been wrestling for quite a few days. They're wrestlers. They're conditioned

Eight different Tigers collected two victories on the night. In addition to the 'Big 3' senior trio of Ian Baker (145), Alex Quinn (152) and Chase Kinemond Everyone has to do their part, (160), also posting a pair of 'Ws' were

"It's a big confidence booster for our kids," River coach Eric Rosen said. "We're just happy we can fill almost all the weight


"With the exception of 106, we have a good lineup. We'll keep doing that as we plug our way into sectionals.




