# Tough decision

### MAC holds off OVAC in 'Clash of Champions'

ST. CLAIRSVILLE — It wasn't the decision the OVAC All-Stars were looking for Tuesday night during the 19th annual "Clash of the Champions" inside St. Clairsville High School.

Dropping eight of the 13 matches — seven by decision — the locals came out on the short end of a hotly contested, 28-20, decision to Western Pennsylvania's Midwestern Athletic Conference on John Jenkins Court.

"We were on the other side tonight as far as the last couple of years," OVAC and Steubenville Catholic head coach Aaron Henry said. "We wrestled well. We lost a couple of close matches, but this is a

great group of talent."


Despite the loss, the OVAC still holds a 13-6 advantage in the all-time series, which dates back to 1988. It was held annually until 1995, and resumed in 2003, according to meet officials.

Trailing 9-0, the OVAC reeled off a trio of victories by University's Isiaih Hood (132); Caldwell's Kameron Rayner (138); and Union Local's Zac Sowers (145).

Hood and Rayner, both 2014 Ron Mauck OVAC Tournament champions, scored major decisions to cut the gap to 9-8, and Sowers' 4-0 blanking of Ellwood City's Donnie Kerr gave the hosts the only lead of the night at 11-9.

"I just went out there to have fun," Sowers, who was a Division III state alternate this past season, said. "I wasn't worried about winning and losing, but I did want to score points for the OVAC."





## OVAC matmen to shine Tuesday

ST. CLAIRSVILLE - The Ohio Valley Athletic Conference will look to continue its dominance as the 26th annual "Clash of the Champions" unfolds Tuesday night inside St. Clairsville High School. The OVAC has won four of the last five events, including 43-21 last season at West

Allegheny High School. Tuesday night's match features OVAC All Stars against Midwestern Pennsylvania All Stars. It will be held on John Jenkins Court, starting at 7 p.m.. The event has been held annually since it originated in 1988. It alter-

nates sites between the conferences.

A banquet honoring the wrestlers, parents, coaches and guests will be held Monday night at Undo's in Weirton, starting at 6.

The OVAC All Stars are selected by placement in last January's 61st annual Ron Mauck Tournament held inside WesBanco Arena in downtown Wheeling. The top senior placer in each weight class gets first shot at the team. If he declines, then the opportunity goes to the next highest senior placer, and so on until someone accepts.

This years OVAC team is comprised of six tournament titlists, a trio of sixth-placers, and one each that finished third, fourth, seventh and eighth. It also includes eight state qualifiers in either Ohio or West Virginia, and seven state placewinners, with half-a-dozen of them from the Mountain State. There will not be a match contested at 106.

OVAC champions on the roster are Isiaih Hood (132, University); Kameron Rayner (138, Caldwell); Johnny Davis (152, Wheeling Park); Eric Banks (160, Wheeling Park); Leo Hermann (170, Steubenville Catholic); and Geremy Paige (220, Wheeling Park).

Rounding out the team are Tyler Wiley (113, Caldwell); Josh Cornell
