OVAC duals slated to begin this week

• John Marshall, Steubenville serving as the host sites

The fourth annual Bill Hinegardner Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Dual Team Tournament will be held Wednesday and Thursday at the John Marshall Fieldhouse in Moundsville and Steubenville High School's Crimson Center, respectively.

The top four qualifying teams in three of the four classifications – 1A/2A, 3A and 4A – will do battle while seeking the coveted OVAC championship banners. There were only three Class 5A schools qualify. They will compete in a round-robin format.

"A lot of teams didn't commit to the tournament for various reasons," Director Jim Rocchi explained. "Some of them might not have thought they had a chance, so they decided to wrestle somewhere else on that night."

Class 3A and Class 5A kick off the event Wednesday in Moundsville where two mats will be utilized.

In Class 3A, top-seeded Magnolia (6-0) and No. 4 River (4-3) meet in one semifinal. The other has No. 2 Lintsly (6-2) facing third-seeded Barnesville (7-3). The two victors will meet for the championship. The Cadets won the recent 62nd annual Ron Mauck OVAC Tournament Class 3A, with Magnolia and Barnesville finishing second and third, respectively.

On Thursday, Class 4A has No. 1 Oak Glen (10-4) going against fourth-seeded Meadowbrook (7-4), which qualified because East Liverpool didn't wrestle enough matches against OVAC schools. Second-seeded Beaver Local (3-2) meets No. 3 Edison (5-2) in the other semifinal.

Top-seeded Shadyside (6-0) meets No. 4 Clay-Battelle in one Class 1A/2A semifinal. The Cee-Bees qualified because No. 3 Weirton Madonna and No. 5 Cameron didn't qualify. Second-seeded Caldwell and No. 3 Toronto collide in the other semi. The winners meet for the title.

Defending champions include Shadyside (1A/2A); Steubenville Catholic (3A); Steubenville (4A); and Parkersburg South (5A).

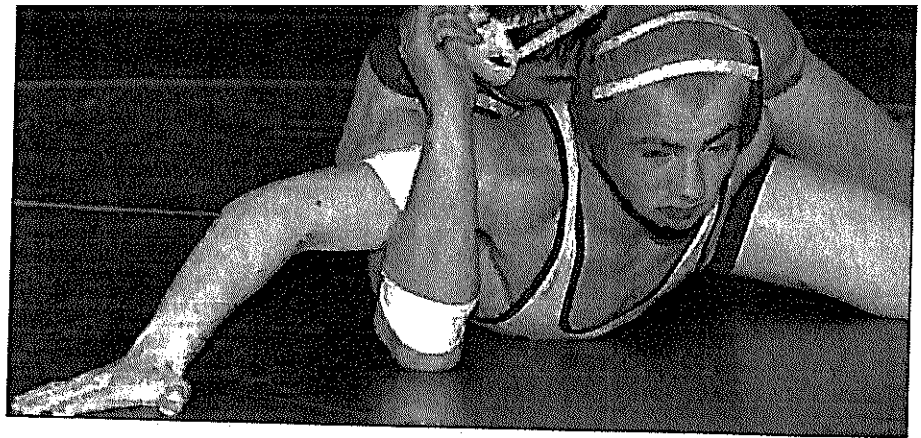

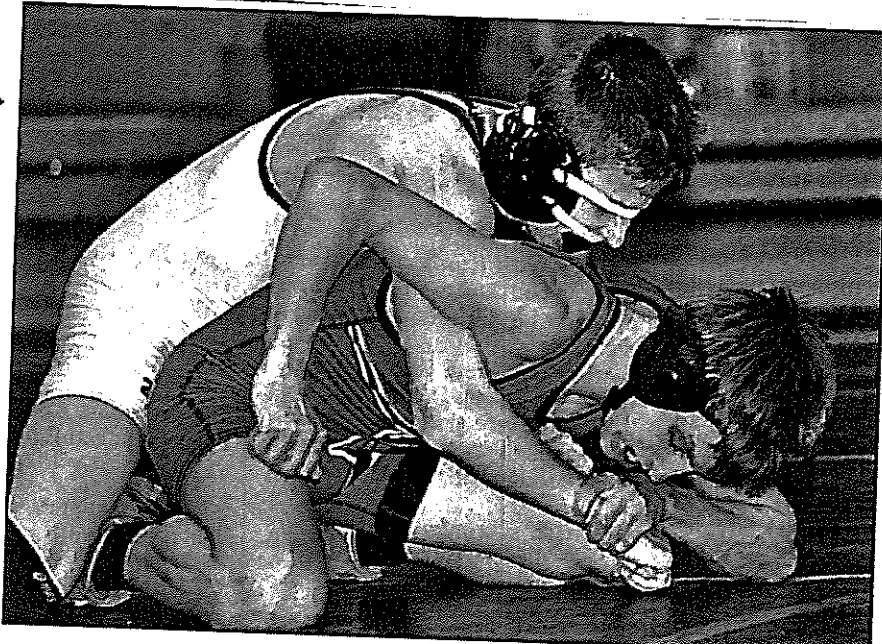

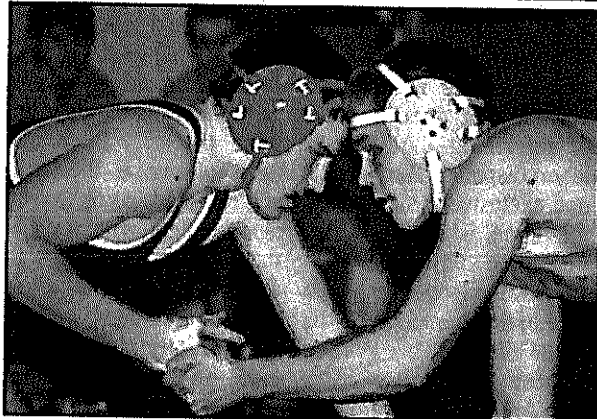

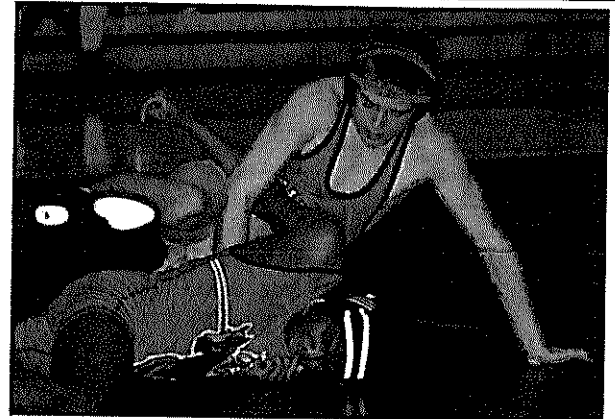

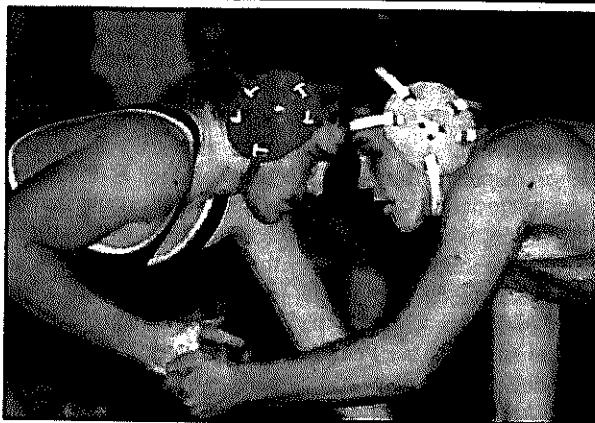

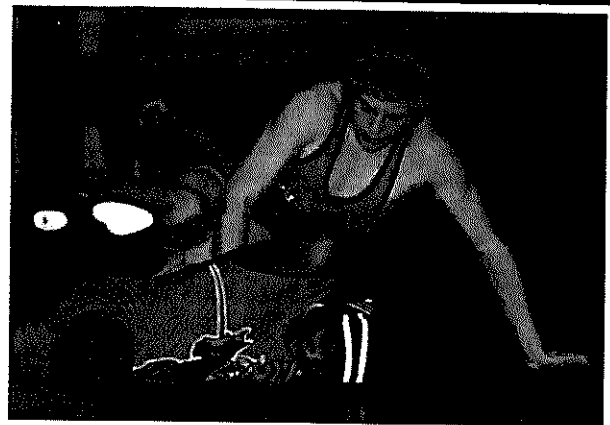

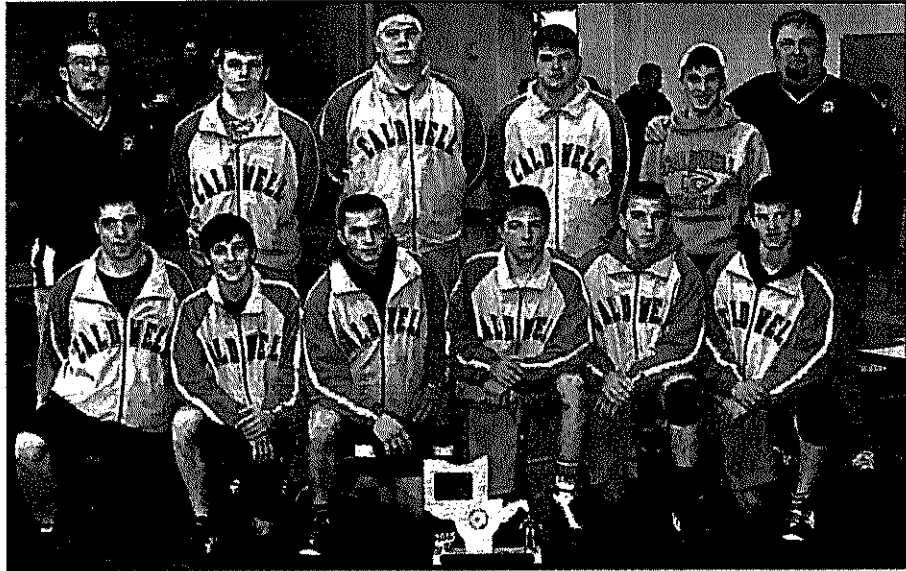

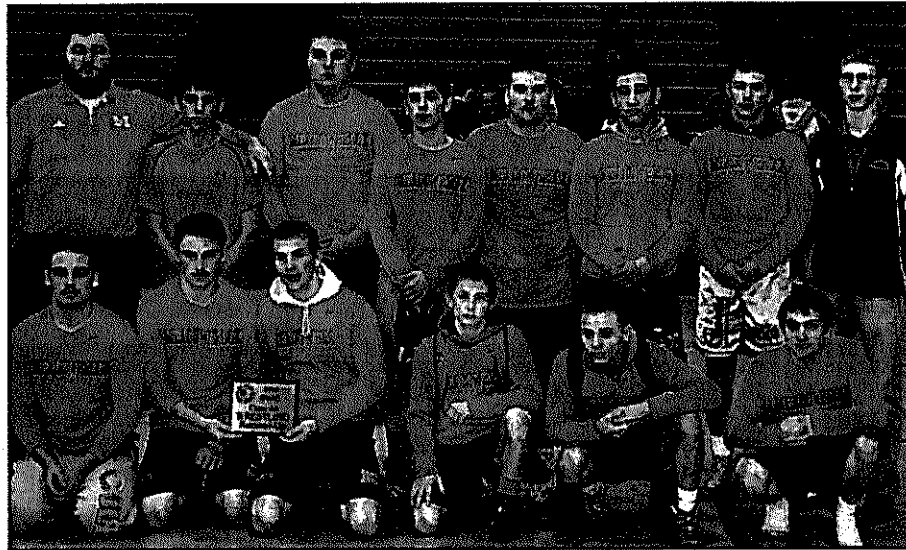
