

CAGE CHATTER

BASEBALL PASS: When a player throws a long pass to a teammate with one hand, as if throwing a baseball.

BASE LINE (OR END LINE): Line behind the basket, the legal boundary between the playing floor and out of bounds.

BRICK: Ball shot without proper backspin or rotation usually by a poor percentage shooter, known as "brick layer."

THE BREAK: When one or more players break away from the pack with the ball for an easy hoop (or layup)... shooter sometimes known as "cherry picker" or "snowbird."

CHARITY STRIPE: Term for the free-throw line, from which foul shots are taken. It's fifteen feet from the plane to the face of the backboard.

DOUBLE-TEAM: situation in which more than one player guards an opponent.

FILLING THE LANES: When a team gets a fast break underway, the first thing it does is fill the lanes; that is, a man goes up each sideline and a third goes down the middle.

OUTLET: Pass to a man on either sideline to initiate movement by a rebounding team down to other end of floor, starting a fast break.

PICK AND ROLL: Occurs when a man moves from a "pick" to the basket, looking for a pass from the man he has just "picked" for.


POST: A location on the court assumed during an offensive play. **High Post:** a location in or around the circle or key area. **Low Post:** a location close to the basket, either left, right or in the lane. The player moves into the high or low post depending on team's style of play or game variables.

SWITCH: What you holler on defense when you have no idea where your man went; frequently another word for "HELP."



“US vs. THEM” Mentality In Sports: But “WE” Is The Answer

Is there anyone out there who wants to hear another side of the “us vs. them” argument?

In this case I am referring to the coaches vs. officials syndrome.

In recent weeks, a number of articles have contained items where fingers were pointed at officials for being somewhat less than capable.

In certain instances, a team’s loss was actually blamed on the officiating. In another case the player’s misbehavior and unsportsmanlike acts were attributed to poor officiating.

“The officials took the game away from the kids,” was the lament of one coach.

Another coach in an unrelated game said, “The officials let the game get out of hand.”

These represent two directly opposite statements that reflect part of the problem—and the officials are the central focus of both statements.

Before continuing, one important disclaimer must be made. Just as some coaches are better than others and some players stand out while others don’t, so it is with officials.

While this article is written by an official, it is not intended to defend all officials. It is merely a viewpoint that is meant to cover the vast majority of competent officials.

Let’s take a look at the viewpoint.

On a cold Friday night, the fans who filled the bleachers did little to dispel the wind that carried an icy chill across the football field.

Five men, clad conspicuously in black and white, approached a lone figure standing astride the 50-yard line.

With arms folded and a clipboard pressed firmly against his chest, the man sized up the approaching quintet of football officials.


He eyed each of them head to toe in an effort to discover some quality that would establish their qualifications and remove his doubt and concern.

The five men made a similar appraisal of their counterpart standing at the mid-field hash marks.

“Friend or Foe?” is the unspoken question in each official’s mind.

They meet, but their handshakes and nervous smiles fail to erase the uneasiness of the moment.

Neither the coach nor the officials have been able to establish the fact that they are allied contributors to the upcoming contest.



Each of them silently questions the other’s abilities and motivations. Before the first second has ticked away on the game clock, the atmosphere is seeded with doubt.

All too often this scene is repeated from week to week throughout the fall season.

Coaches and officials unwittingly cast themselves in the roles of adversaries. Yet each has the same common goal: A safe and well-played game, with the outcome decided by the better team.

One would think that this mutual objective would ensure a certain amount of compatibility, but it does not.

Misunderstanding of each other’s role seems to be the major barrier to a harmonious relationship. Each party fails to accurately perceive the other’s intentions.

For instance, the coach’s intensity is often interpreted by the officials as confrontational. On the other hand, the official’s attempt at neutrality is perceived as indifference by the coach.

It is easy to see how these misconceptions can foster an “us vs. them” climate.

If this initial attitude is established, unfavorable things are likely to occur. The parties are postured for unwarranted conflict.

Perhaps if one could step in to the shoes of the other, if only for a moment, the gap could be bridged.

Indeed, each has made the supreme effort to master his trade. Both the coach and the official have paid their dues.

The coach has spent the past few months sunrise to sunset preparing his

players for this evening’s skirmish.

Because he is deeply concerned about his charges, the coach tends their wounds—both physical and mental.

He is expected to teach his youngsters that winning and losing isn’t important—it is the effort that counts.

But he knows, too, that his status will be determined by the columns marked. “Wins and Losses.”

Somehow he is able to balance the contradiction.

Turning to the official, we find a different set of circumstances, although none less arduous.

Because officiating is his advocacy, the official must also deal with the frustrations of his daily job.

Perhaps he would be a better official if he were able to devote eight hours a day to officiating, but that is an unlikely possibility.

Therefore, he does the next best thing: He pursues his love of the game by using his free time to study and sharpen his skills.

They worry about their judgment and they agonize over their errors. To a man, they are dedicated to “getting it right.” They know for them there will be no cheers or accolades.

If the officials have done their job—and done it well—the chances are good that no one will know they were even present on the football field.

Indifferent? No, they just aren’t concerned with who wins or loses.

In the end, it is a game that is played, coached, and officiated by humans.

As such, errors of omission and commission will be made. Judgment, based on perception, will be subject to conflict.

And one’s point of view will often determine the extent of the conflict.

While everyone involved is seeing the same game—and it is indeed a “game”—it is just viewed from different angles.

One must remember that the whole picture is the sum total of all the angles.

Perhaps if one views the whole picture, “us” and “them” will become “we,” and there will be much less blame to pass around.

I might be wrong, but that’s how I see it.






