

# Big Red Touchdown Club Honors Bellaire Athletes

**CITING** THE qualities of athletics, Dr. James L. Chapman, president of West Liberty State College and guest speaker at the annual Bellaire Big Reds Touchdown Club banquet Monday night, said there's a great deal to be gained educationally in athletics.

The fete, held at the First Presbyterian Church and honoring the Bellaire High football and cross country teams, was climaxed with a special Big Reds Touchdown Club award to retired basketball coach Clare L. Cribbs, who has been a member of the Bellaire High faculty since 1949.

The presentation was made by one of Cribbs' former athletes, Bill Thomas, who presently serves as Bellaire High athletic director.

Dr. Chapman, an admitted sports enthusiast, told the athletes that must apply to such attributes as education, emotion, enthusiasm and equality on an off the field.

"These qualities which are

demonstrated in athletics will make the difference when carried on in life," Dr. Chapman said. "Athletics also provides the thrill of being involved, but there must be a commitment to excel."

Speaking of equality, Dr. Chapman noted that there was no other area in our way of life where equality has emerged as much as in athletics.

Other special awards presented on behalf of the sponsoring Big Reds Touch-

down Club were plaques to Bruce Stolz and Willie Sparsman, former Bellaire High athletes who were the defensive co-captains at West

Liberty State College last season.

Head football coach Jake Olasvsky presented the William Marinacci Memorial "most valuable player" award to the captain Dan Mlynek and the John Lambros Memorial "most underrated player" award to Jack Oera.

Olasvsky also announced that tri-captains would lead the Big Reds next fall. They are quarterback Joe Masciarelli, halfback Greg Ewarj and tackle Dave Liberrati.

A native of Batavia, N.Y. Korrowski received a bachelor of fine arts degree

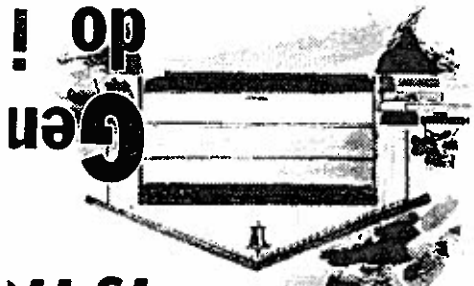

"We did so well during racing at the start of this year that we decided to add a little more to the season this time," said Graham. "But things sure have been going better than I had anticipated. We've got a chance now to make it to \$95 million and it would be great if we do."

Waterford ran the majority of its 1973 schedule of 305 racing post time. Its night racing schedule usually extends from the Middle of March through December.
