who ne'er will yield.

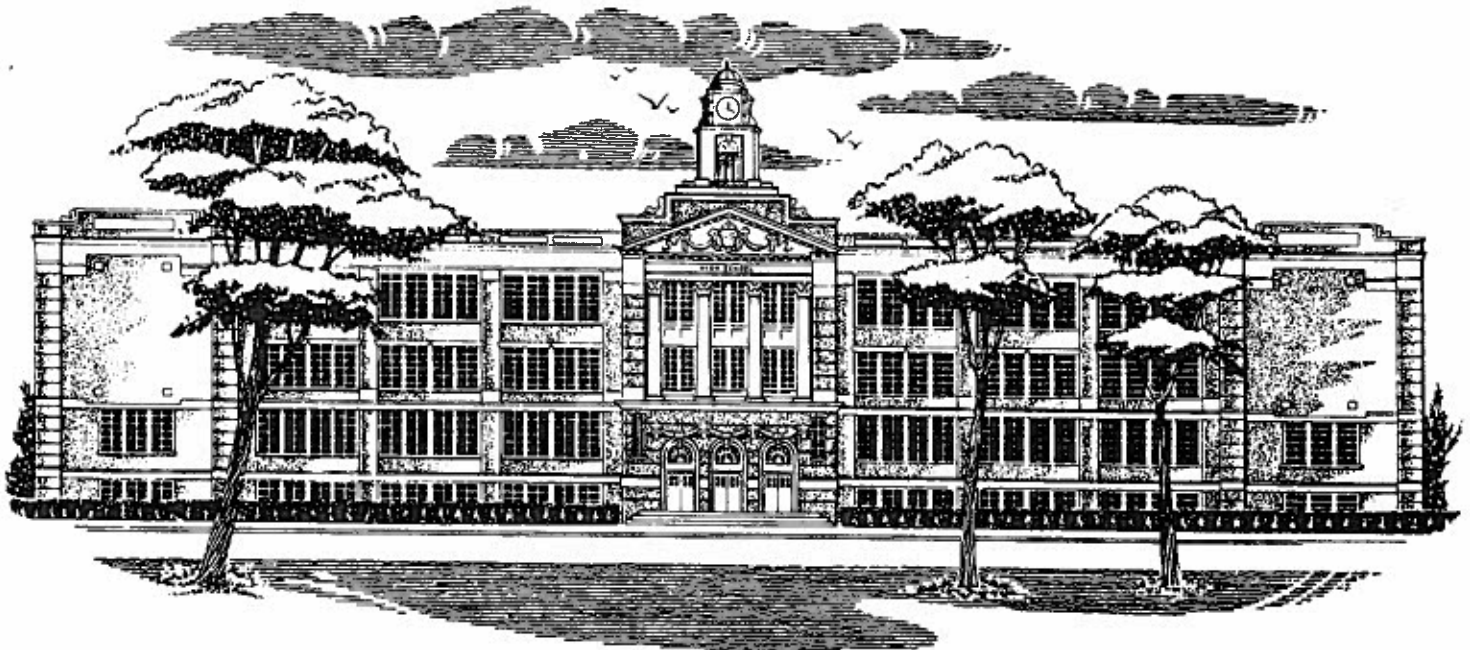

DARREN KINDER

Darren has demonstrated strong leadership qualities since he entered BHS as a freshman. Becoming involved in football, basketball, and track in addition to carrying a college prep curriculum, Darren was selected as President of his freshman class. He also found time to join the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. As a sophomore, he joined the Student Council and instantly became a contributing member through his willingness to work, especially with Homecoming decorating. He was still a three-sports performer in addition to staying with FCA. It was during his junior year that he began to blossom. A varsity letterwinner in two sports, Darren also joined the Publications Staff as a sportswriter and was selected Boys' State Alternate. With the drug testing program beginning, he was selected to serve as a member of the Drug Steering Committee. Saving the best till last, Darren excelled his senior year. He was chosen captain of the football team, which fashioned a fine 8-2 record and just missed a State playoff berth, captain of the track team, which was the best in Belmont County, and president of the Student Council. Continuing with publications, Darren was also inducted into the National Honor Society.

Graduating 20 in a class of 162, Darren plans to continue his education at Kent State University, joining his older brother, Todd. A member of the Bellaire Christian Church, he is the son of Harold "Babe" Kinder and Connie Schramm Kinder.

NELSON LANCIONE was an honor graduate in the Class of 1936. Upon graduation from our Alma Mater, Nelson entered The Ohio State University where he graduated from the College of Law in 1943.

Following graduation from OSU, Nelson began his career with the United States Treasury Department. Initially, this took him to the Philippine Islands where he served first as a U.S. Treasury Representative and later, after Philippine independence on July 4, 1946, as Acting Treasury Attaché at the American Embassy in Manila. Before leaving his post in Manila, Nelson was one of the few Americans who received a commendation for his service from the President of the Philippines. While with the U.S. Treasury Department, Nelson assisted in administering the Trading With The Enemy Act.

Nelson returned to Ohio in 1949 to accept appointment as Assistant Attorney for the State of Ohio. Two years later he opened his private law practice in Columbus. Nelson served as Special Counsel to the Ohio Attorney General's Office between 1958 and 1962 and as Secretary and General Counsel for the North American Equitable Life Insurance Company between 1959 and 1968. He also served as Chairman of the Franklin County Board of Elections between 1973 and 1979.

Nelson is a member of the American, Ohio, and Columbus Bar Associations, the Association of Trial Lawyers of Ohio and Franklin County, the American Society of International Lawyers, and a Fellow of the Ohio State Bar Foundation.

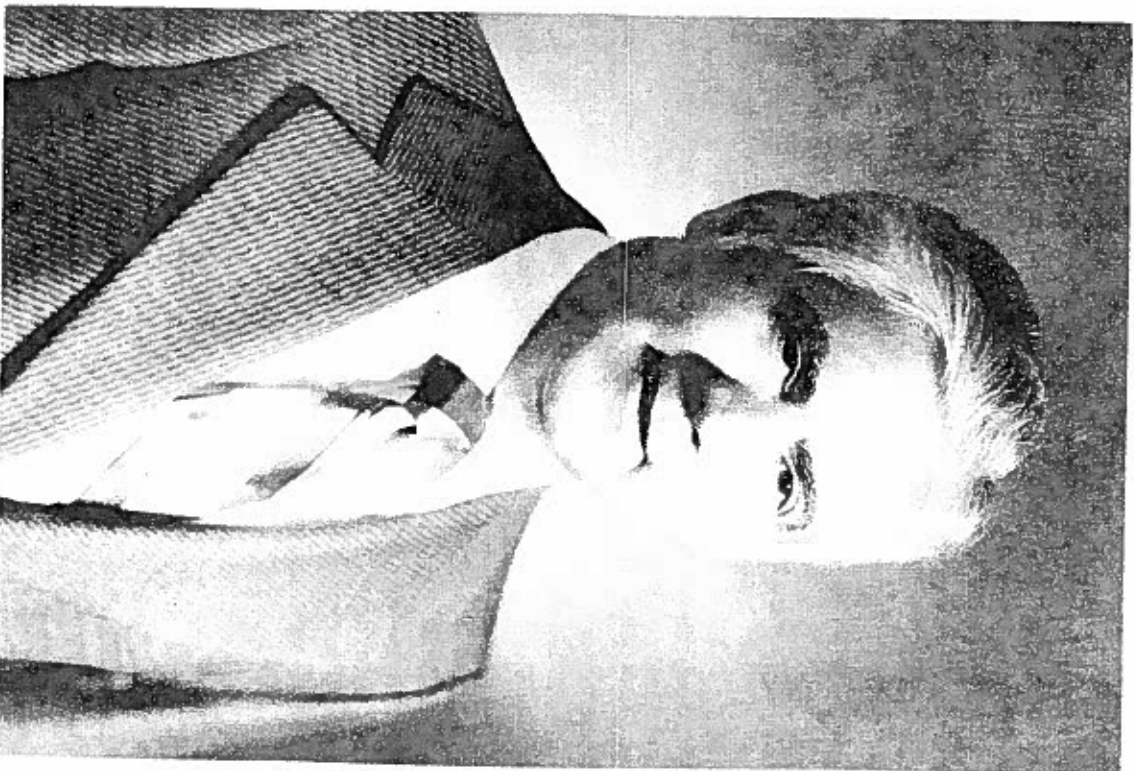
Political endeavors have kept Nelson very active for many years in the Democratic Party. Beginning with the Young Democratic Clubs of America at county, state, and national levels, Nelson moved on to the Franklin County Democratic Party, where he served as Chairman from 1972-1977. He has served as a member of the Executive Committee for the Ohio State Democratic Party for many years. Nelson has also been a delegate to the Democratic National Convention several times.

Nelson has been an active member of the Columbus Area Chamber of Commerce, the OSU Alumni Association, Big Brothers Association, OSU President's Club, and the Moose (life member). With the involvement with the professional, political, and civic organizations, Nelson has created an image that is very hard to follow. Through his hard work and dedication to his profession and his community, Nelson has been named to International Who's Who in Community Services, Who's Who in American Law, Who's Who in American Politics, and Who's Who in the Midwest.

Nelson and his wife, Tilitie, a Pittsburgh-area native who he met while in the Philippines, reside in Columbus, as do sons Robert and David. Another son, Nelson William, resides in Florida.

NORMAN A. BRUTCHEY ('61) Box 395, Nef's, Ohio 43940 * Norman Brutchey is a name recognized throughout Bellaire by even the youngest of Big Reds. After graduation from high school, Norman attended Ohio University and then West Liberty State College, where he received his B.A. in Elementary Education. He later earned his M.A. in Elementary Education from West Virginia University. Norman began his teaching career in 1965 with the Marshall County (WV) Schools. In 1968, he was employed by the Bellaire City Board of Education at Key Ridge School. He became a principal in 1973, and was assigned to Rose Hill School. In 1984, he returned to Key Ridge as principal. Norman is actively involved with the elementary children in the Bellaire School District spending time with Enrichment Programs, computer education, and the Odyssey of the Mind program. Norman is also involved with the Ohio Association of Elementary School Principals. In what little spare time that remains, Norman has completed post-graduate courses at Ohio University, WVU, The University of Dayton, and The University of Detroit. Woodworking and fishing are favorite past times. Norman is married to the former Anne J. Maker ('61), and the couple has one daughter, Dawn Elizabeth, who graduated in 1980.

Upon receiving his law degree, Lou was a Trial Referee for Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, Division of Domestic Relations. In 1981, he moved to Columbus to become Administrative Assistant to the Chief Justice of the Ohio Supreme Court. In 1983, Lou was appointed Director of the Ohio Supreme Court. When appointed, he was the youngest Supreme Court Director in the United States.

He presently serves as Special Counselor to the Cuyahoga County Treasurer. Lou has been involved with various committees of the Ohio Supreme Court, Ohio Judicial Conference, and has served as a lecturer at five of the law schools in the state. He is involved with the Ohio Democratic Party Central Executive Committee as well as with the Cuyahoga County Democratic Party Executive Committee. Lou is a former member of the AFL-CIO Local 350 at Edison Burger Plant and the UMW District 6, Local 1441 of North American Coal. State politics and real estate investments take up what free time Lou has in his schedule.

SONJI "SONNY" HERZBERG (50) 2872 Berwick Boulevard, Columbus, Ohio 43209 * Sonny Herzberg is a name often heard throughout Bellaire today. While at BHS, Sonny was an outstanding athlete. He went on to Kent State University to letter four years in football while attaining his Bachelor in Architecture degree. He was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers, but turned down the opportunity to play professional football in order to serve in the U.S. Army. While in the Army, he served as a First Lieutenant of Engineers involved in building army installations and air fields in Germany. Since then, he has been in the private practice of architecture, first in the Ohio Valley, and then later moving on to St. Croix, Virgin Islands, and the State of Alaska where he designed the Fairbanks Airport. Sonny finally returned to Ohio and he is presently involved in a private architectural firm in Columbus. Later he received his M.A. from West Virginia University and his M.A.E. in Guidance and Counseling from the University of Guam. During the past few years, post-graduate work has been completed at the University of Dayton, Detroit University, and WVU. Gary has been in education since 1962, when he began teaching at Fairpoint Elementary School. He then moved to Martins Ferry High School before spending several years as a guidance counselor at Agat Junior High

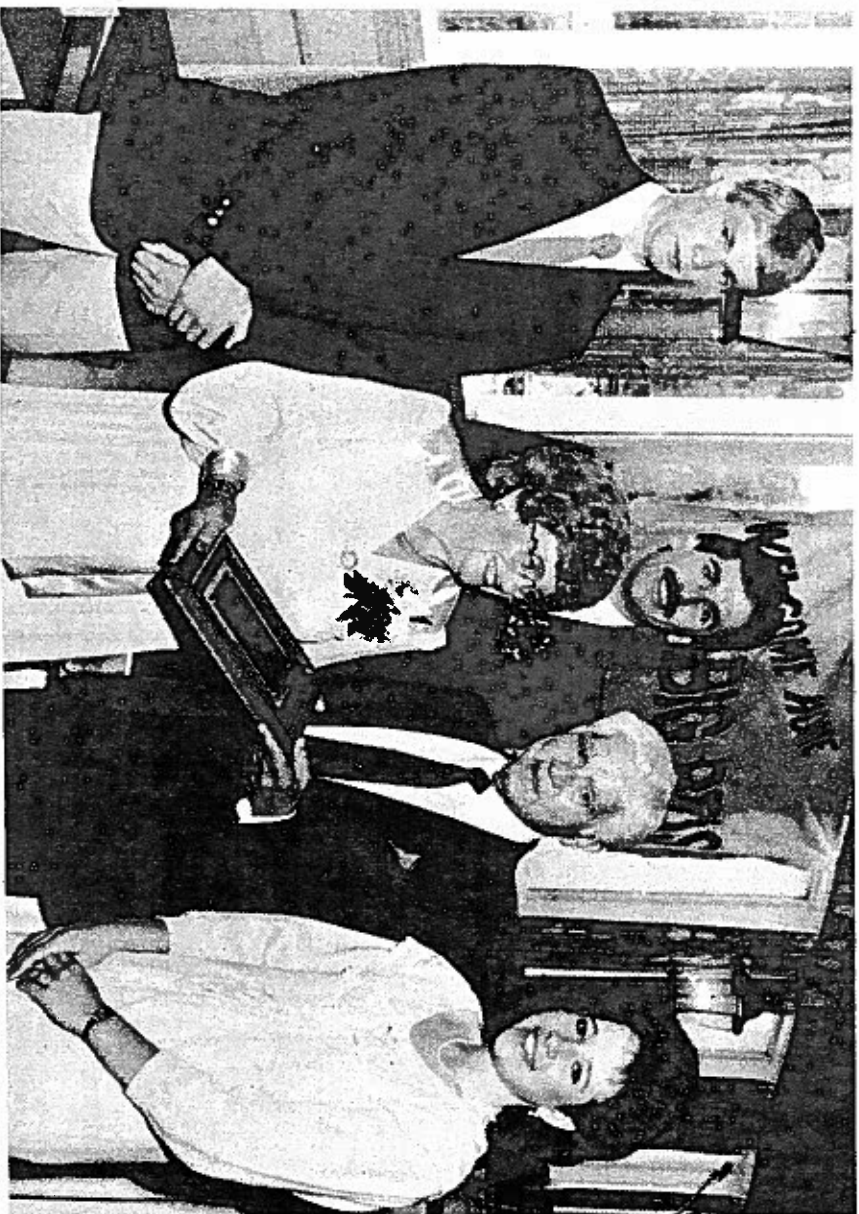
